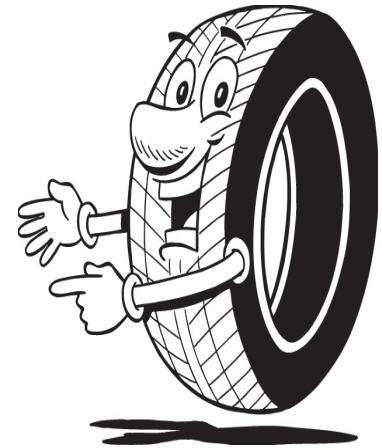

Many members were disappointed that during our Spring clean-up tires were not accepted.

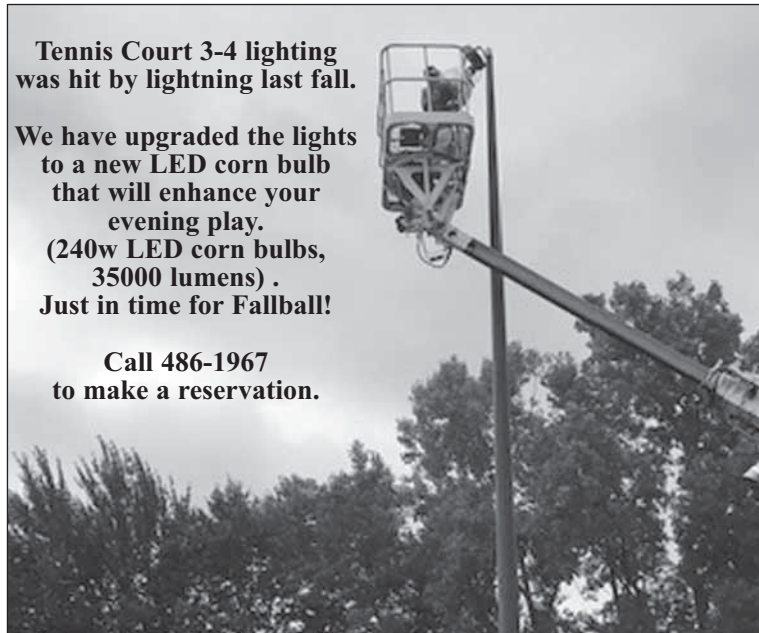

Community Project: Cleaning Out Storm Drains

Catch basins and sewer inlets are for rainwater and melting snow only. Crews from the City of Fort Wayne's Water Pollution Control Maintenance Department, the department responsible for cleaning catch basins and storm sewer inlets, recently pulled a number of unusual items out of some City sewers including: boots, cellular telephones, VCRs, realtor signs, buckets and file cabinet drawers.

These items should NOT be put into storm sewer inlets. The only thing that should ever go into a storm sewer is rainwater or melting snow.

In addition, children should NEVER play in or around storm sewer inlets or manholes.

For storm or sanitary sewer questions or emergencies, please call 427-1255.

Fishing Rules

Fishing is permitted in the lake areas of: Bri-tany Village, Shenandoah Circle and Lake Crystal.

FISHING RULES

1. Arlington Park residents only (ID required).
2. Fishing equipment must be picked up when leaving the area.
3. No motor boats of any kind are allowed.
4. No harpoons are permitted.
5. No Bow and arrows are permitted.
6. Children under age 10 should be supervised.

ARLINGTON PARK'S DOGGIE PADDLE DAY RULES

- All current animal license is required for entry. Current licenses from other cities and counties will be honored. It is the responsibility of the owner/handler to provide proof of current license and current rabies vaccination upon entry.
- Dogs will be allowed to be off-leash on the pool deck only.
- Dogs should be allowed ample time to relieve themselves prior to entering the pool area. Owners/handlers must clean up after their dogs (bags and receptacles are provided).
- By completing this form I am agreeing that to the best of my knowledge, my dog has never had altercations with other dogs and is dog, people, and child-friendly. Aggressive dogs are not allowed. Owners/handlers of any dog(s) exhibiting aggressive or unruly behavior will be required to immediately remove the offending animal.
- There must be one owner/handler for every dog admitted.
- Owner/handlers must be over 18 years of age. Children under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult.
- All ages of dogs are welcome. Dogs over the age of 6 months must be spayed or neutered.
- Dog owners/handlers are both personally and legally responsible for their animals. You are using this facility at your own risk and are personally and legally responsible for the actions of your dog(s).
- Any actions that are considered by staff to be unsafe, potentially dangerous, injurious, or non-beneficial to guests and dogs will not be allowed.
- No toys or balls are allowed to doggie paddle day this year (dog life preservers are allowed).
- Humans are not allowed to be in the pool (lifeguards are permitted).
- Masks or face shields are required as social distancing with those outside of your immediate family.

Fort Wayne Walking Tour

VisitFortWayne.com/WalkingTour

Starting at the Visitors Center, 1, cross Washington Street and step into the beautiful Grand Wayne Convention Center, 2, via their Harrison Street entrance.

Go straight through the building and exit the Grand Wayne Center on the Jefferson Blvd side, across from the Courtyard by Marriott, and Conner's. Cross the street and head left. You will pass the historic Embassy Theatre, 3, which opened in 1928 as a movie palace and vaudeville house. In front of the theatre, look on the ground for plaques with information about the theatre and its history.

Right next door, you will find your first stop at the Foellinger-Freimann Botanical Conservatory, 4. Surround yourself with nature at an oasis in the heart of downtown. Enjoy lush seasonal displays, four outdoor gardens, the Tropical Garden with orchids, palms, and a cascading waterfall, and the Sonoran Desert Garden. Visit the Gift Shop.

Across the street, you will find the Diocesan Museum, 5, home to dozens of church artifacts, another great stop for history and religion enthusiasts.

Now head north on Calhoun Street, where you will pass several local restaurants and coffee shops. Turn right on Berry Street and stop in the historic Lincoln Tower, 6, an art deco masterpiece that still houses a bank and operating soda fountain!

After two blocks on Berry, you will come to the intersection of Barr Street. This is your next stop: The History Center, 7. Allen County Fort Wayne Historical Society and museum. Little Turtle to Anthony Wayne to inventions that originated in this area; 26,000 historic artifacts available for study.

Then, continue going north on Barr St for one more block. At Main St, you've reached the Arts Campus. On your right side is your

next stop at Auer Center for Arts and Culture, 8. The Auer Center is home to many nonprofits, including Artlink. Artlink's mission is to showcase work of the highest quality by exhibiting more than 20 shows each year of emerging and mid-career artists and provide educational opportunities for the community.

Feeling the need for more art? Your next stop is right across the street! The Fort Wayne Museum of Art, 9. This contemporary museum offers works from permanent collections and national traveling exhibitions. You'll also enjoy their unique gifts.

Detour Alert! Detour alert! If you'd like to see Historic Fort Wayne, a reproduction of our original Fort, you can head north on Lafayette at the Museum of Art. Just across the bridge, you will find the Old Fort, whose grounds are open to explore at any time!

After leaving the Museum of Art, head west on Main St. You will pass the Arts United Center and Freimann Square on your right and the Allen County Courthouse, 10, on your left. Feel free to stop and take a look at this national historic landmark. (Although open to the public, they ask that you not bring any phones or cameras into the courthouse.)

Getting hungry? There are two Fort Wayne favorites to choose from close by. The first is located about half a block west on Main St. - Fort Wayne's Famous Coney Island, 11. Try their famous Coney Dogs and coke from a glass bottle! The second option will be later on your route: Cindy's Diner, 12: an authentic '50s diner. Serving the "Whole World" 15 at a time! Breakfast served any time.

If you choose not to stop for lunch, you will turn right on Calhoun Street and then left on Columbia. You are now on a very

important historical street known as The Landing, 13. Once a stop along the Wabash-Erie Canal, The Landing has new life today as a residential, commercial and retail hotspot!

After traveling the delightful block of Columbia Street, you are only steps away from Riverfront Fort Wayne's new Promenade Park - a destination in itself! Promenade Park, 14, offers family fun, river access, dining options and more!

If you are able tear yourself away, head back into downtown by traveling south on Harrison Street, travel for two blocks, then turn right on Berry and left on Webster. You will pass Cindy's Diner and have come to the Allen County Public Library, 15, which is home to the The Genealogy Center: location of the nation's largest public genealogy collection, and housed in a brand new, \$65 million facility!

On your way back to the Grand Wayne Center you can stop at the Firefighter's Museum, 16. Located in historic Engine House No. 3, this museum showcases artifacts used by some of the city's earliest heroes - the firefighters.

Just a block away, you will see Parkview Field, 17, home to TinCaps Baseball. If you'd like, you can stroll through this stadium, it is open as a public park on all non-game days.

For a birds-eye view, head to the top floor of the neighboring Hampton Inn, 18, where you can enjoy a drink and overlook the ballpark from Conner's Rooftop!

Then, simply cross the street and you have returned to the Grand Wayne Center and Fort Wayne Visitors Center!

For more information, stop into the Visitors Center, located on the corner of Harrison and Washington at 927 S. Harrison Street.

5-Ingredient Mexican Quinoa Stuffed Peppers

These 5-ingredients Mexican Quinoa Stuffed Peppers are made with fresh and healthy ingredients. They are vegetarian, yet filling. And so tasty!

6 medium bell peppers (any color), tops cut off and cores removed.

1 pkg. Morningstar Farms Chiptole Black Bean Crumbles, cooked according to package instructions.

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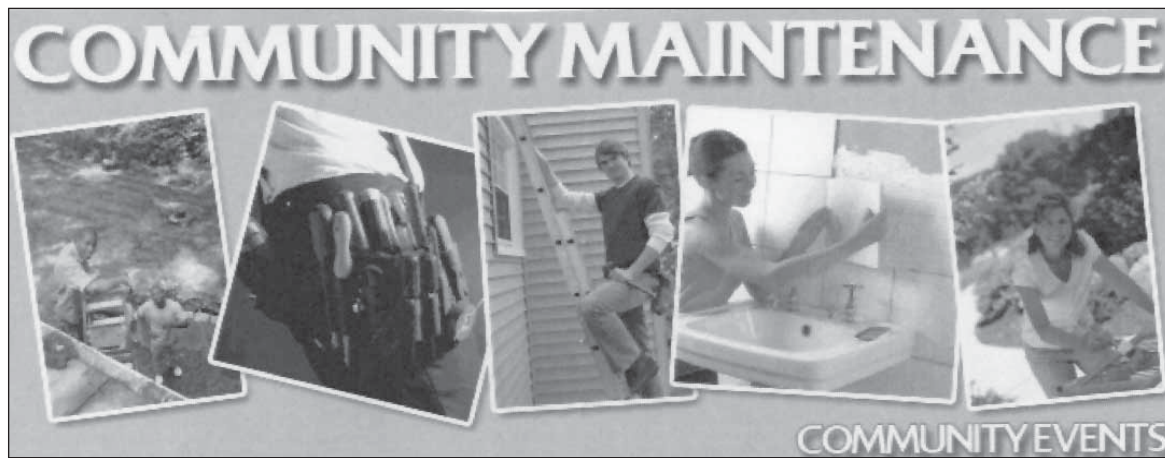

Each greenway light is numbered at the top of the pole just under the greenway head. If you see a light pole not burning, call 486-1967 to report.

We also wanted to remind

every home owner that before you dig in the area along the sidewalks call 486-1967 at least 72 hours before you begin a project.

Arlington will mark the greenway underground lines to prevent damages.

Arlington's network of greenway lights is not part of the Don't Dig Blind notification. The area behind your home is typically a 40' pedestrian right of way easement.

Many members don't realize the area is filled with under-

ground wiring.

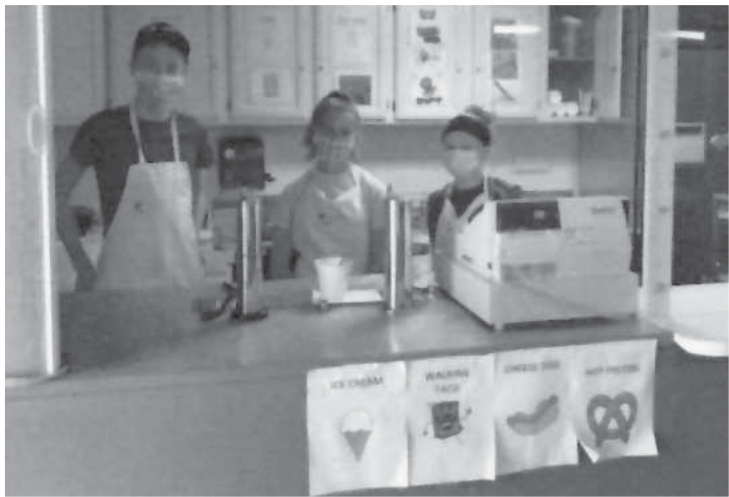
