

Election Procedures

 Arlington Board of Directors candidates must be residents in good standing (Association dues must be current and paid in full. The candidate cannot have an unsatisfied judgment against them).

· Candidates interested in running for Arlington Park Board of Directors positions must notify the clubhouse of their intent to run for office in writing.

The letter of notification must be postmarked no later than Dec. 31st.

· Ballots will consist of only candidates' names that meet the requirements of notifying the clubhouse in writing no later than Dec. 31st and are members in good standing of Arlington Park.

 Candidates wishing to have a short article in the "Arlington News and Views" introducing themselves to Arlington residents may submit a biography to the clubhouse before the 1st of January.

All candidates eligible for election and any submitted biography shall be published in "News and Views".

 Proxy Ballots will be available 30 days prior to the election at the clubhouse. Members may obtain a proxy ballot within that time at the clubhouse.

All completed proxy ballots must be received at the Arlington Park clubhouse by 1st class US Mail or by sealed envelope hand delivered to the Arlington Park clubhouse on or before the 3rd Tuesday in February in order to be counted.

• Voting for positions on the Arlington Board of Directors starts at 7:00 a.m. and ends at 7:00 p.m. on the 3rd Tuesday in February.

Voting takes place at the Arlington Park Clubhouse. No votes will be accepted at the annual meeting.

• The qualifying ballots will be counted by the election committee on the 3rd Tuesday in February.

The committee will validate signatures and lot numbers as votes are tallied.

• The results will be announced by the election committee at the Arlington Park Annual Meeting, by signage at the entrances of the addition, and printed in the "News and Views".



Where and How to Recycle or Dispose of Christmas Trees in Indiana in January 2021



In many urban and suburban areas, Christmas trees are collected from curbside during the first 2 weeks in January.

Allen County residents may drop off and recycle their live Christmas trees at various locations free of charge, starting Thursday, Dec. 26, 2020 to Saturday, Jan. 11, 2021.

Be sure to remove all remove all lights, wire, tinsel, ornaments, nails, stands, other NON-Organic decorative materials and other materials that are not part of the original tree. This includes tree stands also. Flocked trees are usually accepted, but not artificial trees. Large trees (larger than the standard 6 - 7 ft tree) may need to be cut in half to be acceptable by your garbage hauler. But scroll down this page for more specific information and local links.

What happens to the trees? In most cases, the trees are chipped and made into a mulch which is usually made available, free to city or county residents. Important: Never burn your Christmas tree in a fireplace or wood stove. Burning the tree may contribute to creosote buildup and could cause a chimney fire.

Snowmobiling...Not Permitted

Indiana Snowmobile Laws

14-1-3.5-15 Operations Restrictions Sec. 15: A person shall not operate a snowmobile:

1. At a rate of speed greater than is reasonable and proper having due regard for conditions that exist.

2. While under the influence of an intoxicating liquor or unlawfully under the influence of a narcotic or other habit forming or dangerous depressant or stimulant drug.

3. During the hours from onehalf (1/2) hour after sunset to one-half (1/2) hour before sunrise without displaying a lighted headlight and a lighted taillight.

4. In any nursey, planting area, or public lands posted or reasonably identified as an area of forest or plant reproduction and when growing stock may be damaged.

5. On the frozen surface of

public waters within one hundred (100) feet of a fishing shanty or shelter except at a speed of five (5) miles per hour or less.

6. Unless equipped with a muffler in good working order and in constan operation to prevent excessive or unusual noise and annoying smoke.

7. Within one hundred (100) feet of a dwelling between 12 midnight and 6 a.m., except on his own property or property under his control or as an invited guest.

8. On any property without the consent of the landowner or tenant thereof.

9. While transporting thereon a bow unless unstrung, or a firearm unless unloaded and security encased or equipped with and made inoperative by a manufactured key locked trigger housing mechanism.

10. On or across a cemetery or



burial ground.

11. Within one hundred (100) feet of a slide, ski or skating area, except for the purpose of servicing the area.

12. On a railroad track or railroad right-of-way, except railroad personnel in performance of their duties.

13. On public property unless authorized to do so.

Food Traditions for Good Luck in the New Year

Black-Eyed Peas

Resembling coins, these beans are said to bring prosperity in the New Year and are often enjoyed in the traditional southern dish known as Hoppin' John. In some households, enjoying this traditional dish may be preceded by a hopping dance performed around the table by the children.

Buttered Bread

New Year's Day in Ireland is also known as Day of the Buttered Bread (or Sandwich, depending on the Gaelic translation you use.) Tradition says buttered bread placed outside the front door symbolizes an absence of hunger in the household, and presumably for the year to come.

Grapes/Raisins

Tradition in Spain says 12 grapes or raisins eaten just before midnight (one at each chime of the clock) will bring good fortune for all 12 months of the year, as long as you finish all 12 before the final stroke!

Pork




