## Arlington Park Association President's State of the Association 2021

to the 48th Annual Arlington Park Neighborhood Association meeting.

A year ago this evening, as we spoke of the then current state of our Neighborhood Association, this Board and our neighborhood members could never have predicted what the coming months would have in store for all of us on a personal, professional and social level. In the weeks following, our members and our board directors had to completely adjust almost every aspect of daily life to deal with the ever changing new world of Covid-19. Each day, and sometimes, each hour, provided a new development, rule or behavior change that caused disruption to our lives, anxiety, fear and sometimes anger. Many of our members began to work from home, students learned from home, jobs were lost, and unrest marked the path for demonstrations, dialogue, and hope for change. As our members adjusted to the "new" world around them, something remarkable happened. We turned to our neighborhood as our sanctuary. Stuffed animals appeared in windows for scavenger hunts; our sidewalks exploded with activity as members went out to get fresh air, exercise, and social distance with one another in the safest way possible. Chalk-written messages of encouragement appeared on those same sidewalks, along with exercise recommendations for the day. Every day

Good evening and welcome weather allowed, members were out on the golf course and social distancing in the common areas. People waved at one another, picked up items for the elderly at various stores and spoke kindly to one another (from a safe distance, of course). Our members really looked at their neighborhood and liked what they saw! We began to receive recommendations on how to make things even better.

> In the meanwhile, the Arlington Park Board of Directors had their hands full. Each day brought new challenges as we did our level best to abide by the ever changing rules for opening and operating our golf course, pools, and clubhouse facilities. There were times of great frustration for all of us. The revenue from guest passes and outside memberships to our pool, golf course and clubhouse rental were all greatly diminished. These are the revenue sources that we rely on to keep our dues from increasing at the rate of inflation each year. Indeed, there were some scary moments and tough decisions. We trimmed our budget to focus solely on maintenance and upkeep of amenities for the remainder of 2020. I am happy to say, it worked!

> We were very fortunate that the timing of the Covid-19 health crisis coincided with an Arlington Member moving back into the neighborhood who happened to have in interest in our board. Our newest board member until this evening. Alavna

Hackert, CRNA, MSN, an Advanced Practice Nurse Anesthetist, among several other specialties, joined our board in March. Alayna provided our board with understanding of the complicated and ever-changing Covid-19 landscape. So many of our members just wanted to grasp the "why" behind the rules, regulations and changes. Alayna was able to provide some much needed clarity to both the board and for members, so that decisions were made based on much greater knowledge. Many thanks to you Alayna!

Each year at this time we get together to talk about the "State of our Association" and I am relieved to tell you all this evening that the State of the Association is very sound and secure. We were able to meet our needs in upkeep and maintenance of the amenities and maintain jobs for the employees that see to those tasks. This was only accomplished with serious attention to detail and juggling to stay somewhat open and yet abide by the rules given to us. Thanks to our members and their understanding and patience, the staff and board here at Arlington brought us through the year and we were able to budget for 2021 without an increase in dues to our members. Another factor that greatly contributed to this successful year-end result is the fact that Arlington Park utilizes a 10 year set aside fund, a longterm budget, to handle longterm capital expenditures and

avoid assessments to members for costly repairs or upgrades. Our members, this year and every year, face few "surprises" as our larger-ticket maintenance upkeep and replacement costs are already budgeted for years in advance. These fellow board members and our Executive Director, Janie Baker, have gone above and beyond to make 2020 the best that it could possibly be for our members. Yes, there were times we had to close the clubhouse, pool and even golf to meet Allen County Health Department rules or to accommodate for Covid-19 exposures. In fact, almost the entire pool staff and office staff were exposed to Covid-19 directly at one point over the summer resulting in an unexpected shutdown of the pools and clubhouse. But just

giving up and shutting the doors to activities was not the right answer for our members, so we continued making the required adjustments, to offer everything we could to the members facing equal challenges every day in their own work and homes.

Zoom meetings helped us survive the year as the board struggled to analyze data from afar and make decisions without a crystal ball to see into 2021. I cannot offer enough praise to the tireless effort from these volunteer members who serve our community. They have given so much this year for our neighbor-

city and county officials, who themselves were working with skeleton crews or from home. found creative ways to distance employee schedules, worked from home and quarantined more than she would have liked from exposures while working for the members of Arlington Park.

Have no fear, we will continue to keep in touch with them as we do so many past Board Members when we have questions or issues that can utilize their expertise and advice. Thank you Mindy and Ron for all the volunteer hours and knowledge you have lent to the neighborhood! We also said "goodbye" to another newer Board Member this year when she moved from the neighborhood. Linda DeWeese may not have served

on the board for very long, but she stepped right into the role of Secretary and volunteered for many activities... even prior to her Board tenure. Linda will indeed be missed.

This evening, we have the pleasure of announcing the results of the 2021 election. We are pleased that Roger Hubart has agreed to volunteer for your neighborhood yet again and is on the ballot this evening. Roger is probably known best for his social committee work and Euchre nights! We look forward to welcoming Roger again to the Board. Also on the ballot is Heidi Colone. Heidi will bring a wealth of knowledge to the board and we are excited to work with her! Welcome Heidi!



If you do not have storage space inside the garage, please find an area on the side of the home that is least visible to the neighbors. Thank you!







# How to be a good neighbor...

Listed below are a few helpful suggestions from our Architectural Committee.

**New Paint:** Homeowners are free to repaint their homes using a color identical to the existing

**Roof Treatment:** When a home requires a new roof, homeowners are free to re-roof their homes using the identical color adn type of shingle found on the existing home.

Antennas and Satellite Dishes: Satellite dishes are required to be less than 36 inches in diameter to be placed at the rear of the hose, not visible from the street and to be screened from view form the

Outdoor Furniture: All outdoor furniture must be located on a porch or patio area. Furniture is not allowed on the lawn except during use. Also, plastic stack furniture should not be stored in a stacked position in a visible, outdoor location.

Play Equipment and Toys: Arlington Park is a family community so children are important part of our community. In order to maintain harmony childrens toys should be stored indoors or in an orderly fashion that they are screened part of the backyard not visible from public view. Bicycles and other riding toys should be

kept in the garage when not in use. No play structure or equipment is allowed in the common areas.

Swimming Pools: Portable swimming pools are prohibited in the convenants. A child pool that can be emptied and stored every evening, out of sight, is permitted.

Lighting: Tasteful accent lights aer encouraged and security lights that do not create a nuisance for other homeowners are permit-

Garage Doors: Garage doors should be opened only long enought to permit car accesss to garage or while someone is working outdoors.



## **Arlington Park Association Treasurer's Report**

The Treasurers report was given by Harlan Altena. Review of the 2021 cash on hand and 2020 Long Term expenditures was given. 2021 prepaid dues were \$149,207.50 or 20% of budgeted compared to 21% in 2020. Cash Reserves \$410,518.09, account receivable at year end was \$28,705.22 including payment arrangements. Arlington remains in good financial standing. A motion to approve the Treasurers report as presented was seconded and carried. Dues paid as of January 21, 2021 was \$310,366.87 or 41%.

Long Term expenditures included:

Golf: \$86,781 for a metal roof for the pro shop, maintenance barn, pump house, bridges and golf irrigation pumps.

Pool: \$26,492.00 for automated chlorine and ph systems, pumps, impellers and a backboard.

Tennis: \$7,811 for a practice board for tennis court #5, repaired lighting on tennis courts #3-4, color coat, pickleball lines for tennis court #1.

Grounds: \$ 12,295.00 included a camera security system, 2-doggi-pots, spring banners for the entranceways, updated lighting for the bulletin boards and sidewalks.

Clubhouse: \$8,200.00 for furnace and air conditioner for lobby and office.


