- Update Equipment



Arlington Park Association Board of Directors April 5, 2021 • Meeting

In attendance: Executive Director Janie Baker, President Lynda Gevers, Treasurer Harlen Altena, Vice-President Bruce Westendorf by proxy, Secretary Kyle Lehman, Directors: Alayna Hackert, Heidi Colone via Zoom and Gary Johnson as guest.

The meeting was called to order by Lynda Gevers, President at 6 p.m.

Motion to approve March Board Minutes made, seconded and approved.

Gary Johnson presented golf calendar along with fee schedule. Extended evening hours, drainage upgrades and extended tee boxes was also discussed.

Appoint Board Liaison: Lynda Gevers: Human Resources and

Board Development. Harlan Altena: Finance Planning, Grounds and Maintenance. Alayna Hackert: Community Connection. Kyle Lehman: Recording Secretary and Sports Programs. Roger Hubart: Community Connection and Neighborhood Safety. Heidi Colone: Community Connection and Playgrounds. Bruce Westendorf: Special Projects and Publications.

Appoint Committee Chairman: Kim Bowman: Architectural Control.

Summer Tennis Program is moving forward. Schedule and fees were presented. Rates have remained the same.

Swim and dive schedule presented. Concessions will be back

to full schedule. Full lifeguard staffing remains an issue. Mask and cleaning protocols were discussed. Doggie Paddle event will take place after Labor Day.

Brookshire Circle: Progress being made on removal of sidewalk. project will be complete the week of April 5th. Finished work will include a drainage swale.

River Greenway: The city provided a proposal to connect the internal walks of Arlington with the future expansion of the river Greenway along Wheelock Road. The board voted unanimously against the proposal.

Social Media Policy: the final policy was presented and approved.

Harlan Altena gave finance review. 91% of dues collected versus 90% of dues last year for a total of \$677,672.50.

Other business: Lynda Gevers provided annual update on progress towards internal management five year planned and annual goals. Noted lack of progress in Covid affected areas and resulting restructuring of particular goals along with additional board recommended policy long term budget protection. Alayna Hackert raised the potential for a dog park and will engage wih the City for potential opportunities with the Parks Department. A motion was made to develop a committee for the 50th Anniversary of Arlington Park celebration in 2022.

Motion to adjourn, seconded and passed at 7:45 p.m. Next scheduled meeting will be May 3, 2021 at 6 p.m.

A neighborhood project everyone may lend a hand!

Keep the storm drains open during our April showers. Please pick up any debris in the street especially around storm drains to allow for the water to flow and keep flooding to a minimum.

Catch basins and sewer inlets are for rainwater and melting snow only. Crews from the City of Fort Wayne's Water Pollution Control Maintenance Department, the department responsible for cleaning catch basins and storm sewer inlets, recently pulled a a number of unusual items out of some City sewers including: boots, cellular telephones, VCRs, realtor signs, buckets and file cabinet drawers.

These items should NOT be put into storm sewer inlets.

The only thing that should ever go into a storm sewer is rainwater or melting snow.

NEVER PUT ANY OF THESE ITEMS INTO A STORM SEWER INLET:

Automobile fluids like oil or anti-freeze, leaves, sand or topsoil, grass clippings or other yard wastes, scrap lumber or any chemicals.

Clogged catch basins and inlets can cause many problems including odors, street flooding, even injury to maintenance employees.

In addition, children should NEVER play in or around storm sewer inlets or manholes. For storm or sanitary sewer questions or emergencies, please call 311.

Call Before You Dig!

As homeowners you may be purchasing Internet and/or phone services with all of the NEW technology now being offered. This will require companies to dig in our neighborhood. Because Arlington has an elaborate system of greenway lights running behind the homes, this poses a possible predicament. We are asking all residents planning to add new service or replace old service to give us a call at the clubhouse at 486-1967 or email us: Info@arlingtonpark.net. Before you dig! Arlingtons electrician will locate all of our underground lines free of charge. All we ask is 72 hours notification before the digging is to being. Remember, Don't Dig Blind!

Anna Yaggy - Assistant Dive Coach


This is Anna's fourth year coaching for Arling-

- I. It is incumbent upon the members of the Pool Advisory Committee to do the following:
- Review and make recommendations to the Arlington Board of Directors concerning, but not limited to, policies, procedures, and rules involving the operation and utilization of the swimming pool facilities, as well as the construction, renovation, and/or any major capital.
- Review and make recommendations to the Arlington Board of Directors concerning, but not limited to, the budget for the pool facilities, including all expenditures and income, as well as the hiring of all pool personnel.

II. The membership of the Pool Advisory Committee shall consist of eight (8) Association members, and shall be originally appointed by the Arlington Board of Directors. Members will serve two year terms, and will be eligible for reappointment. Terms will exist on a calendar year basis.

The members of the Pool Advisory Committee will elect a chairperson, who will serve one year and will be eligible for reappointment.

Any vacancies on the Pool Advisory Committee will be filled by a simple majority vote of the Committee members, with a quorum of five members required.

* A mandatory restbreak is enforced 15 minutes on the hour.

ALL RESIDENTS AND THEIR GUESTS ARE WELCOME

The Arlington Park Pool Rules apply to all individuals (residents and/or guests) without regard to age, gender, race, disability and/or national origin, pursuant to all Federal, State and Local status, laws and ordinances.

POOL SAFETY COMES FIRST!

1. Members must have ID tags to be admitted to the pool area. All guests <u>MUST</u> be accompanied by an Arlington Park Member. Guest Fees: \$4 per adult and \$2.00 per child per day. Ask about our 3 and 7

day passes. The association is not responsible for lost or stolen items.

- 2. Individuals under the age of 12 or unable to be responsible for themselves must be accompanied by a responsible person 12 or over to gain entrance to the inside pool area. Non-adult members over the age of 12 and under the age of 21, may bring up to 3 guests in a visit.
- 3. Swimmers must pass a proficiency test (*See*: Red Band Rule section of document) in order to swim in any area ofthe lap/sports pool and/or deep end of the multi depth pool. **NON SWIMMERS ARE NOT ALLOWED IN THE LAP/SPORTS POOL AND/OR DEEP END OF THE MULTI-DEPTH POOL.** In addition, individuals wishing to use the 3 meter diving board also must meet the height requirement of 4 ft. or taller. Swim test may be administered to any member or guest at the discretion of the Lifeguards to ensure safe swimming for our members and guests.
- 4. THE WADING POOL IS FOR NON-SWIMMING INDIVIDUALS ONLY. Safe conduct and maximum occupancy is strictly enforced. Lifeguards are not provided in the wading pool; parents, guardians or a responsible individual must stay with non-swimming individuals in this pool to ensure safety.
- 5. U.S. Coast Guard approved personal flotation devices are permitted in the two shallow areas of the multi depth pool and the wading pool.
- 6. A rest break will be observed each hour for patrons under 18 other than individuals participating in a scheduled class or activity.
 - 7. Diving is permitted in designated areas ONLY.
- 8. Lap lanes are reserved for proficient lap swimmers.
- 9. Eating and drinking in designated areas ONLY. No alcoholic beverages or glass permnitted during regular pool hours. **NO COOLER PERMITTED.**
- 10. Pushing, running on the pool deck, profanity, vulgar remarks or misconduct shall not be permitted. Lifeguards have full authority to enforce rules.
- 11. Appropriate swim attire required. No street clothing or cutoffs. Dressing or undressing is restricted to the bathroom areas.
- 12. Incontinent individuals must wear approved swim diapers or plastic swim pants with tightly fitting elastic at the waist and leg openings. The Center for Disease Control (CDC) recommends diapers be checked and changed at least every 60 minutes and we request our members and guests adhere to this recommendation. There shall be no pool side changing of diapers, however, individuals may use the restroom areas. Proper, sanitary disposal of swim diapers is required.
- 13. NO PETS PERMITTED! Approved 11/2/202 BOD

RULES AND REGULATIONS DIVING BOARD RULES

A swim proficiency test is required for all children under the age of 9 using the diving boards. (see Red Bank Rule)

Children under the age of 9 must pass the Red Band proficiency test and be at least 4 ft. tall to use the 1 meter or the 3 meter diving board – FOR THE SAFETY OF OUR MEMBERS AND GUESTS THERE ARE NO EXCEPTION TO THIS RULE!

Patrons must wait at the bottom of the ladder for their turn, taking care not to interfere with the divers.

Only one diver at a time is permitted on the board.

The diving board is the only entrance to the diving area in the pool.

Recreational divers must jump or dive using only one bounce. No running off the end of the board, handstands, sitting or back dives are permitted.

Only jumping and diving straight off the end of the board is permitted.

All divers must carefully observe the diving well and wait until the previous diver has cleared the area before diving.

Immediately after diving, the diver must surface and swim clear of the diving area.

All diving board equipment may be adjusted by Aquatic personnel ONLY. Any activities deems unsafe by the Aquatics personnel are not permitted. Only one diving board may be in operation at any time in one pool facility.

dried out before placing in the container. We cannot accept paint in a liquid form because it may leak out onto the ground or street.

Cleanups are from 8 a.m. to noon. Containers will be delivered by 8 a.m. and picked up between noon and 2 p.m. on the same day.

Do Not Overfill the container. Debris must not hang over the sides or stick up higher than the sides of the container, and the door must be able to close.

The neighborhood is responsible for the container. If it is overfilled, the neighborhood will be responsible for leveling off the container prior to pickup. If unacceptable items are placed in the container, the neighborhood is responsible for removal and disposal of the item(s).

No Rain Date for Containers/ trucks. We will not be able to pick up containers and deliver them on another day if it is raining. If there is thunder and lightning, DO NOT, under any circumstances, try to do your cleanup.




