

Getting darker earlier: Security Preparations

ARLINGTON SECURITY In an effort to provide a safe environment for you and your family the Association provides approximately 4 hours per day of security. The officers patrol traffic, run periodic radar for speeding, watch your home while you are on vacation and provide a phone service for nonemergency questions.

The phone service should be used for concerns on suspicious activity or any non-emergency questions and may be reached by dialing 260-385-3562. For emergency dial 911. FWPD 260-427-1222.

When preparing for a vacation we ask that you notify the Clubhouse with the following information:

1. Name, address, phone number

2. Dates you will be away and returning

3. Who, if anyone, may have a key to your home?

4. Who to contact in case of an emergency.

Suggested Safety Preparations

1. Stop your mail and news-papers.

2. Tell your neighbors you will be out of town and ask them to alternate the timed lighting or park their car in the driveway.

3. If someone will be checking the house, ask them to alternate the timed lighting or park their car in the driveway.

4. Check all doors and windows before leaving and disconnect electrical appliances that are not necessary.

Please keep your yardlight in good working order! This will offer additional security and help deter vandalism in Arlington Park.

FORT WAYNE, Ind. (WANE) The Headwaters Park outdoor ice skating rink is tentatively scheduled to open to the public on November 21, but the 18th season of operation will be unlike any previous one because of the coronavirus pandemic.

Assembly of the rink is set to begin this week and once it opens attendance will be limited to 50 percent capacity and masks or face coverings will be required on the premises and on the rink unless the current mask order is lifted by Indiana Governor Eric Holcomb.

Social distancing will also be required and advance reservations will be accepted. There will be hand sanitizers stationed at the park and other features to protect guests and staff. Restrooms and ice skates will be cleaned and sanitized on a regular basis. Guests may rent skates or bring their own. Extra precautions in the concession room will also be taken to provide safely for guests and staff.

The plan has been approved by the Allen County Department of Health.

"The pandemic continues

to have a strong hold on Indiana, but we felt it was important to continue the tradition of outdoor ice skating this winter, with extra precautions in mind," said Geoff Paddock, Executive Director of the Headwaters Park Alliance.

Details of this season's sponsor, hours of operation, and pre registration details, will be announced at a later date.

PREPARING FOR FALLING RAIN AND LEAVES

NEIGHBORS HELPING NEIGHBORS

Sometimes heavy rains can totally overwhelm Fort Wayne's storm sewer system. In autumn,

falling leaves can block storm drain inlets causing standing water and localized flooding even during smaller rain storms. You and your neighbors can protect your property and help ensure that emergency and other vehicles have access to your neighborhood by doing the following:

KEEP THE DRAINS CLEAR

1. Be a good neighbor and remove leaves and other debris from the gutters and storm sewer inlets near your home before it rains. This helps in several ways:

- Helps prevent street flooding during future rain storms
- Keeps your neighborhood looking tidy and well maintained

2. If you notice that your street is flooding, clear accumulated leaves and debris from storm sewer inlets to keep the water flowing.

3. Manage yard waste properly by keeping it out of the street and storm drain.

4. Never pour chemicals, grease, oil, paint or any other fluids down storm sewers.

Fort Wayne's Street Department employees will be picking up leaves and will clean leaves off the streets this fall. But the City also relies on your efforts as a good neighbor to reduce flooding and protect property in your neighborhood.



Neighborhood Leaf Pickup schedule listed

Leaves are beginning to change color and fall, so Fort Wayne Street Department crews are gearing up for leaf collection starting the morning of Oct. 29th.


Collections will occur two times in each of the city's more than 400 neighborhoods, with the last week of collection starting in December.

For curbside leaf pick-up residents should rake leaves to the curb or park strip in front of their home, but not into the street. Leaves should be in the park strip by 7 a.m. on Monday of the week the leaves are to be collected for your area. Other yard waste should not be mixed with the leaves.

Residents can access daily collection updates at cityoffortwayne.org/leaves. There they will find a neighborhood schedule updated daily, collection map and general leaf collection information. This daily update will soon and residents can call 427-2603 for daily updates.

You can also schedule a pickup if you place your leaves in biodegradable bags by calling 311. The bags should be placed at the curb and will be collected within two business days of the call.

Don't put leaves in your trash or recycling cart. This is against state law, and burning leaves



is a violation of city code and can result in a fine. Don't place leaves in or over storm drains. Parents should remind children to not play in leaf piles near the street.

Income \$906,930.20 Association dues will increase to \$725 from \$685.

budget was made, seconded and passed.

Other business – Possible solutions for golf carts on association property will be researched for next meeting. Doggie Splash event was successful. A possible pumpkin drop off for pumpkin recycling and Pickle ball operations were discussed.

Motion to adjourn, seconded and passed at 7:40 p.m. Next scheduled meeting will be November 1st, 2021 at 6 p.m.

Tips to Keep in Mind

• Rake Leaves to the park strip by 7 a.m. on the first day of the week when crews will be in your area.

• Don't put leaves in your trash or recycling cart. This is against State of Indiana Law.

• Don't burn leaves. It's a violation of city Code and can result in a fine.

• Don't place leaves in the street.

• Don't place leaves in storm drains.

• To schedule a pickup place your leaves in brown paper biodegradable leaf bags. Set them at the curb and call 311. The leaf bags will be collected within (2) business days of your call to 311.

• Weather conditions or the volume of leaves in a particular area may cause the planned schedule to change. The list of pickup locations will be updated daily by 3 p.m. you may also contact the Leaf Hotline: 427-2302 or the Citizens Services Center at 311 with questions or cityoffortwayne.org/leaves.

• There will be no leaf collection on the following holidays:

- Veterans Day
- Nov. 11th
- Thanksgiving (Nov. 25-26).



Impact of COVID-19 results in solid waste collections changes

September 24, 2021--Due to the continued surge in CO-VID-19 cases locally, beginning Monday, Oct. 4, garbage and recycling crews will collect only City of Fort Wayne-issued carts used for residential collection. In addition, workers will collect one bulk item per week per household. A bulk item is considered furniture or a large non-freon item that doesn't fit in the collection bin.

These restrictions are being reinstituted to protect workers and residents. These practices are

similar among other refuse hauling companies across the country and assist in the efficiency of getting garbage and recycling materials collected even through driver shortages and equipment challenges that are being experienced locally, statewide and nationwide.

When drivers are quarantined due to a person case of CO-VID-19, a family case of CO-VID-19 or exposure to the virus, it makes timely collections more difficult. Also, routes are completed faster when extra bags

outside of carts and additional bulk items don't have to be collected.

The updated collection process will remain in effect until further notice. This type of collection was implemented for several months in 2020 and into 2021 as a result of COVID-19.

Residents are reminded that lids on garbage bins should be closed when placed at the curb or alley for collection. Residents interested in obtaining additional City-issued garbage bins for \$2 and/or additional City-issued re-







Fire Department offers reminder to avoid open burning

As the leaves begin to fall from the trees, people look for ways to remove them. For those considering burning leaves, twigs or trash that have accumulated on their lawns, the Fort Wayne Fire Department reminds everyone to avoid open burning as a general rule.

FWFD Fire Marshal Jim Murua says, "No one is to kindle or maintain open burning consisting of a trash fire, leaf fire, refuse fire, or other open burning according to Fort Wayne City Code."

He explains that there are two exemptions allowed under certain conditions:

1. Bonfire celebrating school pep rallies are on exemption which requires obtaining a Burn Permit from FWFD at least 24 hours in advance of the permitted open burning. Call 427-1102 for more information or with questions.

2. Recreational camp fires for scouting or family cookout activities are allowed without a permit and a subject to the conditions listed below.

These exemptions must be subject to the following:

• A garden hose connected to a water supply, buckets, shovel, fire extinguisher or other approved fire-extinguishing equipment shall be readily available at the burn site.

• Only wood products shall be burned. No leaves, paper or trash.

• A fire shall be attended by a responsible party at all times until completely extinguished.



• A fire shall be located at least 25 feet away from any structure, fence or right of way.

• A fire shall not exceed an area three feet wide by two feet high.

• Anyone who recklessly, knowingly or intentionally kindles, or maintains any open burning consisting of a trash fire, leaf fire, bonfire, refuse fire, or other open burning that damages property of another person may be liable for criminal mischief.

• Any person who maintains burning of combustible materials out of doors or open burning not permitted shall be in violation and may be fined \$50. If the violator does not appear in response to a notice issued to them within a period of 30 calendar days from the date and time shown on the notice, the penalty shall be \$75. Repeat violators will be fined.

Please take the extra necessary to exercise safety at all times.
