Q: How did you become familiar with Arlington Park?

A: Before moving to Arlington in 2011, our time spent here was mainly visiting a few friends who were residents, along with bringing our son to tennis lessons with Vince Williams. Every time we were in the area we asked ourselves, why did we not move to Arlington instead of actually building a house in a nearby neighborhood (therefore feeling moving was not an option).

Well, after spending a bit more time in this neighborhood we decided our desire was to live in this neighborhood was too great to ignore.

Q: After living in Arlington Park, what are some family favorite memories?

A: I would say my favorite memories for our children would be spending summers at the pool and winters sledding down Rock-

et Hill. My middle son would say that he loved living here because three of his best friends lived in Arlington also. My youngest would say he loved being able to hop on his bike and ride to his tennis lessons (which paid off as he is finishing his senior year in college and there on a tennis scholarship). My daughter would say her favorite part was that we chose a house which had two closets in her bedroom.

My husband Eric and I would say we absolutely love the walking trails here and take advantage of them as soon as the weather permits and as late in the year as possible. We also love our neighbors and spending Friday evenings during warmer weather hanging out in the driveway of one neighbor with many from our cul-de-sac.

Q: What Fort Wayne business do you own?

A: I currently am the Owner and Director of Fort Wayne School of Dance. We are a local dance studio that has been in Fort Wayne for 50 years. The previ-

ous owner had to close FWSD in 2019. I had been a dance instructor with FWSD since 1985 and just recently took ownership, reopening in the Fall of 2021.

FWSD spent many years at a location in the North Anthony Shopping Center. Before closing in 2019, it was located in the Chapel Ridge Shopping Center. When I reopened, because of certain circumstances, our location changed to the Georgetown North Blvd. area. After being closed for two years and changing locations, it was great to have many students return. This included our previous younger dancers through adults. Many expressed that they missed our dance family and was very excited to be back.

I've always enjoyed teaching many styles of dance, but would have to say my favorite style is tap dancing. It's great exercise and so much fun to do. My oldest tap student was a gentleman who was 74 years old and said he had always wanted to learn to tap dance. He did a great job proving you are never too old to try something new.

Q: What opportunities will FWSD offer this summer?

A: Our plans for the sum-

mer are to hold a dance camp for children ages 4-12. The tentative dates for the camp are June 20-23. The time would be 6-7:30 p.m. We will also be considering a morning session as well. It's a great time to introduce children to dance or continue their dance education with choreography, snacks, crafts and making new friendships. We will also be holding technique workshops during the month of July for those dancers interested in competition and being considered for our company classes.

Q: What is your advice when choosing a dance studio for children?

A: When parents are choosing a studio for their child, I highly recommend they visit the studio. Ask what policies are for weekly classes and if/when parents can observe their child's lesson. Being able to watch a video or attend a recital is another great way to get a feel for a particular dance studio. And finally, word of mouth. Other's positive experience is a

Public safety departments promote safe, responsible fireworks use

Fort Wayne Fire Department joins with Fort Wayne Police Department and Three Rivers Ambulance Authority to encourage everyone to enjoy fireworks in the safest possible way. "We recommend for everyone's safety that they go to fireworks presented by trained professionals," said District Chief Jim Murua, Fort Wayne Fire Department Fire Marshal. "If they are going to purchase fireworks for private use, we encourage them to use fireworks responsibly and take safety precautions."

Anyone with a fireworks-related complaint is to call the Fort Wayne Police Department at 427-1222.

The Fort Wayne City Ordinance governing the use of fireworks in Fort Wayne which is similar to Indiana's State Fireworks Law which does allow adults age 18 and older to purchase fireworks

for use in Fort Wayne on the user's property, the property of someone who has consented to the use of fireworks, or at a special discharge location designated by the State Fire Marshal.

In the City of Fort Wayne, the fireworks may be used only between 5 p.m. and two hours after dusk (approximately 11 p.m.) from June 29-July 3 and July 5-9. On the day before Memorial Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, the day before Labor Day and Labor Day, the hours are extended from 10 a.m. to midnight. For New Year's Eve, the hours are 10 a.m. Dec. 31 until 1 a.m., Jan. 1.

"According to a report from the Indiana State Department of Health, in 2007 48% of all fireworks-related injuries in Indiana involved children and adolescents. They represent a quarter of Indiana's population so this is a concern. Of these injuries,

69% of cases reported burn injuries with burns to the hands being the most common type of burn injury," said Murua. He explained that of all the injuries in 2007, one in five of those injuries involved the eyes with 92% of those injuries due to not using any eye protection. He noted the report also said that fireworks use on private property accounted for 83 % of the reported injuries. "Fireworks injuries are often severe," he added.

Safety is always the key to any activity and this includes fireworks. For your safety, as well as that of your loved ones, neighbors and the community, the Fort Wayne Fire Department suggests you enjoy your fireworks at a professional event. Tennis Court Reservations

Tennis Courts may be reserved up to 72 hours in advance. Tennis Courts #1 through #7 may be reserved on the even hour for a maximum of two hours. Example 6-7 p.m.

Dog-i-Pot Stations

Remember to use the Dog-i-Pot Stations during the spring months.

When leaving to go outside with your pet, stop by a DOGIPOT and tear off a litter bag so when animal your goes "poo poo" you can pick it up and dispose it in the DOGIPOT Pet Station/Container.



Pool Storm Procedures

1. In the event that a storm arises in the immediate area, lifeguards are urged to keep a constant watch for signs of tornadoes hail or lightning and will close the pool for 30 minutes at a time as needed.
2. Should an electrical storm threaten, the pool will be immediately cleared and an announcement will be made of the closing.
3. If an electrical or hail storm causes the pool to be emptied, residents are not forced to leave the pool area, just to get out of the water until it is safe to return.

Pool Tornado Procedure

1. During a tornado watch the weather will be monitored for safety and may close as needed.
2. During a tornado warning the pool will be cleared and residents are encouraged to go home.

Fishing

Fishing is permitted in the lake areas of Brittany Village, Shenandoah Circle and Lake Crystal. Because we are privately owned a fishing license is not required.

The current harvesting rule is: No size limit on Bluegill, but Bass must be a minimum of 14 inches long to keep or they must be returned to the lake.

Mission of the Pool Advisory Committee

I. It is incumbent upon the members of the Pool Advisory Committee to do the following:

- Review and make recommendations to the Arlington Board of Directors concerning, but not limited to, policies, procedures, and rules involving the operation and utilization of the swimming pool facilities, as well as the construction, renovation, and/or any major capital.

- Review and make recommendations to the Arlington Board of Directors concerning, but not limited to, the budget for the pool facilities, including all expenditures and income, as well as the hiring of all pool personnel.

II. The membership of the Pool Advisory Committee shall consist of eight (8) Association members, and shall be originally appointed by the Arlington Board of Directors. Members will serve two year terms, and will be eligible for reappointment. Terms will exist on a calendar year basis.

The members of the Pool Advisory Committee will elect a chairperson, who will serve one year and will be eligible for reappointment.

Any vacancies on the Pool Advisory Committee will be filled by a simple majority vote of the Committee members, with a quorum of five members required.

* A mandatory restbreak is enforced 15 minutes on the hour.

ALL RESIDENTS AND THEIR GUESTS ARE WELCOME

The Arlington Park Pool Rules apply to all individuals (residents and/or guests) without regard to age, gender, race, disability and/or national origin, pursuant to all Federal, State and Local status, laws and ordinances.

POOL SAFETY COMES FIRST!

1. Members must have ID tags to be admitted to the pool area. All guests MUST be accompanied by an Arlington Park Member. Guest Fees: \$5 per adult and \$3.00 per child per day. Ask about our 3 and 7

day passes. The association is not responsible for lost or stolen items.

2. Individuals under the age of 12 or unable to be responsible for themselves must be accompanied by a responsible person 12 or over to gain entrance to the inside pool area. Non-adult members over the age of 12 and under the age of 21, may bring up to 3 guests in a visit.

3. Swimmers must pass a proficiency test (*See: Red Band Rule section of document*) in order to swim in any area of the lap/sports pool and/or deep end of the multi depth pool. **NON SWIMMERS ARE NOT ALLOWED IN THE LAP/SPORTS POOL AND/OR DEEP END OF THE MULTI-DEPTH POOL.** In addition, individuals wishing to use the 3 meter diving board also must meet the height requirement of 4 ft. or taller. Swim test may be administered to any member or guest at the discretion of the Lifeguards to ensure safe swimming for our members and guests.

4. **THE WADING POOL IS FOR NON-SWIMMING INDIVIDUALS ONLY.** Safe conduct and maximum occupancy is strictly enforced. Lifeguards are not provided in the wading pool; parents, guardians or a responsible individual must stay with non-swimming individuals in this pool to ensure safety.

5. U.S. Coast Guard approved personal flotation devices are permitted in the two shallow areas of the multi depth pool and the wading pool.

6. A rest break will be observed each hour for patrons under 18 other than individuals participating in a scheduled class or activity.

7. Diving is permitted in designated areas ONLY.

8. Lap lanes are reserved for proficient lap swimmers.

9. Eating and drinking in designated areas ONLY. No alcoholic beverages or glass permitted during regular pool hours. **NO COOLER PERMITTED.**

10. Pushing, running on the pool deck, profanity, vulgar remarks or misconduct shall not be permitted. Lifeguards have full authority to enforce rules.

11. Appropriate swim attire required. No street clothing or cutoffs. Dressing or undressing is restricted to the bathroom areas.

12. Incontinent individuals must wear approved swim diapers or plastic swim pants with tightly fitting elastic at the waist and leg openings. The Center for Disease Control (CDC) recommends diapers be checked and changed at least every 60 minutes and we request our members and guests adhere to this recommendation. There shall be no pool side changing of diapers, however, individuals may use the restroom areas. Proper, sanitary disposal of swim diapers is required.

13. **NO PETS PERMITTED!** Approved 11/2/202 BOD

RULES AND REGULATIONS DIVING BOARD RULES

A swim proficiency test is required for all children under the age of 9 using the diving boards. (see Red Band Rule)

Children under the age of 9 must pass the Red Band proficiency test and be at least 4 ft. tall to use the 1 meter or the 3 meter diving board – **FOR THE SAFETY OF OUR MEMBERS AND GUESTS THERE ARE NO EXCEPTION TO THIS RULE!**

Patrons must wait at the bottom of the ladder for their turn, taking care not to interfere with the divers.

Only one diver at a time is permitted on the board.

The diving board is the only entrance to the diving area in the pool.

Recreational divers must jump or dive using only one bounce. No running off the end of the board, handstands, sitting or back dives are permitted.

Only jumping and diving straight off the end of the board is permitted.

All divers must carefully observe the diving well and wait until the previous diver has cleared the area before diving.

Immediately after diving, the diver must surface and swim clear of the diving area.

All diving board equipment may be adjusted by Aquatic personnel ONLY.

Any activities deemed unsafe by the Aquatics personnel are not permitted.

Only one diving board may be in operation at any time in one pool facility.

2. No refunds.

3. Classes Limits to 15 swimmers unless otherwise stated.

4. Tiny Tots must be fully potty trained.

5. A Release Form must be completed.

*Make checks payable to Arlington Park Association, Inc.

Beginner I: 3 years and older. Continues to socialize water/pool area. Teaches good water safety. No skills necessary. Individual attention. 4 to 6 students in each class.

Beginner II: 4 years and older. Will put face in water. Can float and swim some strokes. Will jump off diving board. Individual attention with instructor. 4 to 6 students in each class.

Guest Policy

* Any member under the age of 21 may bring up to (3) guests per visit.

* Members 21 and older may bring up to 10 guests.

* Members bringing guests under the age of 21 must have (1) adult per (5) guests.

* In any one visit no more than 20 guests per household.

* For pool privileges Arlington defines an adult as a member of the community 21 years of age or older.

Guest Fees

* Guest adult for 1 day is \$5 per adult guest per day.

* Guest child for 1 day is \$3.00 per child guest per day (17 and under).

* Family weekend rate of \$10.00 per family for 3 consecutive days.

* Family weekly rate of \$20 maximum per family per week.




POOLSIDE GAMES: On Sunday there will be pool side games and events from 11:45 a.m.-4:45 p.m.

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Guidelines for the success of your new grass

Here is a list of guidelines for the success of your new grass:

- Keep the new seeded area moist (not wet). Water 15 to 20 minutes each day, when needed for best germination.
- Do not use a pre-emergent fertilizer, as this may hinder the new grass development.
- There may be weeds coming up with the new grass. This is to be expected. After several cuttings the new grass should start taking over.
- After 4-6 weeks, you may fertilize your new grass when

you would normally do the rest of your lawn.

- Start mowing when the seedlings are high enough to cut. Mow when surface is fairly dry to prevent rutting and pulling out seedlings with muddy wheels. Mow frequently to reduce weed competition.
- Mulch should be left in

place and allowed to decompose. Premature removal of mulch may affect ability of new grass to mature.

Motion to adjourn, seconded and passed at 7:50 p.m. Next scheduled meeting will be June 6, 2022 at 6 p.m.



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

Unauthorized Removal of Barriers and Barricades

Hereafter whenever the Board of Public Works of the city shall place or cause to be placed any barrier or barricade in or upon any public street, alley or sidewalk in the city because of any repairs or improvements to such street, alley or sidewalk or because of any excavation made therein for public improvements, it shall be unlawful for any person to remove or destroy such barrier or barricade, or to drive any vehicle upon the street, alley or sidewalk or walk or run upon the same. (74 Code, 25-18) (Ord. 2330,

99.999 Penalty) Whoever violates any of the provisions of this chapter, for which no specific penalty is otherwise provided, shall, upon conviction thereof, pay a fine of note more than \$2,500. Each day any violation of this code or of any ordinance shall continue shall constitute a separate offense. In all cases where the same offense may be made punishable, or may be created by different clauses or sections of the ordinance of the city, the City Attorney may elect under which to proceed, but not more than one recovery shall be had against the same person for the same offense.
