The meeting was called to order by Harlan Altena, Treasurer at 6 p.m.

Motion to approve June Board Minutes made, seconded and approved.

Creek Ridge Drainage Plan is still on hold.

Repairs for transformer powering the entrance lighting was discussed. Options were discussed and final decision will be made within the next couple of months.

Summer programs update -- Through end of July the pool will be fully staffed with lifeguards. Come mid-August, the pool will have abbreviated hours due to lifeguards returning to school.

Increasing the sidewalk budget to \$40K for the year was discussed to mitigate rising costs of concrete in the near future. More analysis of existing sidewalk sections due for potential

replacement will be performed.

Other sources of generating income on Arlington's properties was discussed.

An asset tour of Arlington's properties was given.

Finance -- There was no financial report this meeting.

Motion to adjourn, seconded and passed at 7:00p.m. Next scheduled meeting will be August 1, 2022 at 6 p.m.

Important info while construction is ongoing in your area

Garbage/Recycle Pickup

If construction is on your side of the street, garbage/recycle carts will need to be placed across the street for collection. It is recommended that residents place a piece of tape with their address on the lid to help identify their carts. In instances where a cul-de-sac is under construction, residents should move their carts to the end of the street outside of the barricades for collection. We recommend setting carts out the night before collection. Trucks will try to service the construction area first thing in the mornings by 6 a.m. before construction starts. In the event a resident has a disability and cannot move their cart outside the construction area, please con-

tact the Solid Waste Dept. at 427-1345 for assistance.

Unauthorized Removal of Barriers and Barricades

Hereafter whenever the Board of Public Works of the city shall place or cause to be placed any barrier or barricade in or upon any public street, alley or sidewalk in the city because of any repairs or improvements to such street, alley or sidewalk or because of any excavation made therein for public improvements, it shall be unlawful for any person to remove or destroy such barrier or barricade, or to drive any vehicle upon the street, alley or sidewalk or walk or run upon the same. ('74 Code, 25-18) (Ord. 2330, passed --) Penalty, see

99.999.

99.999 Penalty

Whoever violates any of the provisions of this chapter, for which no specific penalty is otherwise provided, shall, upon conviction thereof, pay a fine of note more than \$2,500. Each day any violation of this code or of any ordinance shall continue shall constitute a separate offense. In all cases where the same offense may be made punishable, or may be created by different clauses or sections of the ordinance of the city, the City Attorney may elect under which to proceed, but not more than one recovery shall be had against the same person for the same offense.

Architectural Improvement

Please submit your project at least 30 days before you plan to begin.

As you being your summer projects remember to submit your plans to the Arlington Park Architectural Control Committee. The committee will need a copy of your survey and your construction plans 30 days prior to your beginning date.

Arlington office has many surveys stored and may be able to supply you a copy if you call 486-1967.

Also, remember to call the office for locates of the rear sidewalks lighting if you will be near the easement to the rear of the property. You can call 1-800-382-5544 for all other utilities.

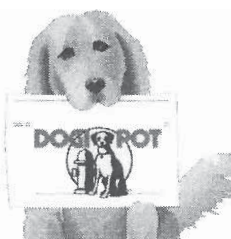

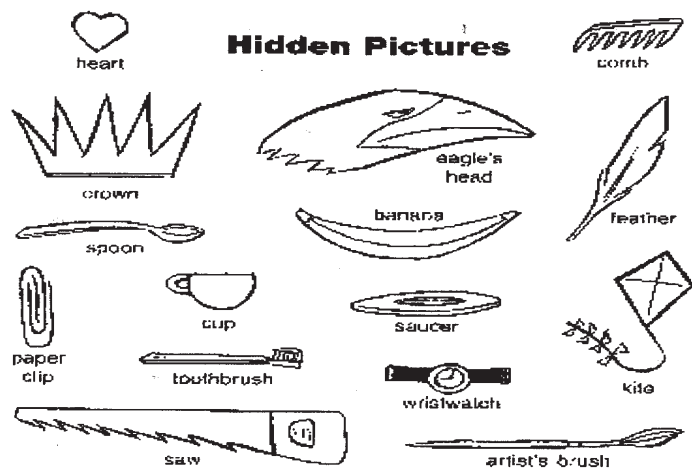
