# Hey Neighbor...Arlington Park Welcomes You to the neighborhood

Welcome to Hey, Neighbor! We hope you find this new regular column to be upbeat, informative, and enlightening. This column is meant to provide information on various monthly topics, while incorporating suggestions for how we can all be good neighbors. We also plan to share fun facts about the history of Arlington Park, our Members, and happenings throughout the neighborhood. As always, while this column is written by Arlington Park Board Members, and we hope we occasionally give insight into the often difficult decisions the Board makes, any opinions expressed in the articles written are those of the writers only, and are not intended in any way to represent the Board as a whole. What does it mean to Be a "Good Neighbor"?

1. Be Giving - You know that saying—"do unto others as you would have them do unto you." That's what we mean here and it's what being a good neighbor is all about! If a neighbor does something nice for you, pay it forward by doing something nice for another neighbor even if no one knows it's you.

2. Be Friendly - You don't always have to go above and beyond to be a decent neighbor. Smiling at your neighbors when they drive by or saying hello when you see them can go a long way. Remaining friendly even to those not-so-nice neighbors can go a long way. You never really know what could be going on behind the scenes.

3. Be Tidy - No one likes a messy neighbor. Even if you don't mind when your yard or home is messy, be courteous to neighbors who do. After all, your neighborhood is their neighborhood too!

4. Be Quiet (ish) - Ok—maybe you're not throwing loud and outrageous parties every night. But either way, a good neighbor should be noise-conscious. If you're planning on hosting a get together and think it might get a little loud, let your neighbors know ahead of time. Or better yet, invite your neighbors to join you!

5. Be Welcoming - Taking the time to just say hello when you see your neighbor outside could go along way. Don't forget that smiles are free and aren't that hard to pro-

duce if you put your mind to it. As you can see, being a good neighbor is simple! When it comes down to it, being a good neighbor is all about being courteous. Trees, for many people, are a blessing and a curse. In the Spring we witness the budding of the trees and many varieties that provide gorgeous blooms that welcome the warming weather after our long, gray Winter. In the Summer, our trees provide much needed shade and the sound of the wind blowing through their leaves evokes a calming sensation. In the first part of Fall, we see the trees give off amazing colors- but then the leaves start to fall. And for many of us, that's where our trees become burdensome. Be a good neighbor this fall season. Be mindful of your leaves throughout the fall. This might mean multiple clean ups, for example, so your leaves are not blowing into your neighbor's yard. It also means keeping sewers and drainage swales (those sloped areas of your lawn that direct rainwater) clear of leaves. Perhaps you have an elderly neighbor that would greatly appreciate someone rounding up

their leaves for them. If you can't physically assist your elderly neighbor, maybe you can help find someone who can. Many of our neighborhood youths also advertise fall clean up for a fair price. Being a good neighbor also means understanding that leaf piles will accumulate in the roads, so slowing down and not deliberately running over these piles is the right thing to do. You should also avoid leaf piles near mailboxes, as our letter carriers need full access to properly deliver our mail. The fall is also an ideal time to care for your trees. Having your trees trimmed or canopied now is a great way to get a jump on your spring clean-up. We have many tree-trimmers that advertise in the News & Views and we encourage our Members to reach out to those businesses who support Arlington Park.

This month back in the year 2015, one of our Members really showed what it means to Be a Good Neighbor. Clyde Poppe noticed that Section VIII-A had no street lights and he reached out to Janie at the clubhouse to look into street lighting for Quail Canyon Run. After

investigating with the City, Janie determined that we could put a request into the City for street lighting- at no cost to Arlington. In addition, a petition would allow for three additional street lights to be installed with the City paying 100% of the cost. Clyde agreed to spearhead the petition; he collected the required signatures from his neighbors, and went a step further, including a reference sheet in his petition to the City which outlined every homeowners' suggested placement. Ultimately the City approved his petition. Clyde saw a need and was-willing to take ownership of what he wanted to see upgraded in Arlington Park. Clyde represented all of his neighbors with precision and honesty and he is a great neighbor and friend to Arlington Park and it's residents. Next month, we want to share the various ways our families in Arlington Park celebrate the upcoming holidays of all religions. ## Getting darker earlier: Security Preparations

### ARLINGTON SECURITY

In an effort to provide a safe environment for you and your family the Association provides approximately 4 hours per day of security. The officers patrol traffic, run periodic radar for speeding, watch your home while you are on vacation and provide a phone service for non-emergency questions.

The phone service should be used for concerns on suspicious activity or any non-emergency questions and may be reached by dialing 260-385-3562. For emergency dial 911. FWPD 260-427-1222.

When preparing for a vacation we ask that you notify the Clubhouse with the following information:

1. Name, address, phone number
2. Dates you will be away and returning
3. Who, if anyone, may have a key to your home?
4. Who to contact in case of an emergency.

### Suggested Safety Preparations

1. Stop your mail and newspapers.
2. Tell your neighbors you will be out of town and ask them to alternate the timed lighting or park their car in the driveway.
3. If someone will be checking the house, ask them to alternate the timed lighting or park their car in the driveway.
4. Check all doors and windows before leaving and disconnect electrical appliances that are not necessary.

Please keep your yardlight in good working order! This will offer additional security and help deter vandalism in Arlington Park.

# 2022 Leaf Pickup Program Announced

The Street Department crews are picking up leaves in the SOUTH areas of the City.

On Monday, Oct. 31st:

To help make leaf pick-up most effective for your neighborhood, please keep the following in mind:

- Rake leaves to the park strip by 7 a.m. on the first day of the week when crews will be in your area.

- Don't put leaves in your trash or recycling cart. This is against State of Indiana law.

- Don't burn leaves. It's a violation of City Code and can result in a fine.

- Don't place leaves in the street.

- Don't place leaves in storm drains.

**WANT TO SCHEDULE YOUR PICK-UP? YOU CAN!**

- Just place your leaves in brown paper biodegradable leaf bags, set them at the curb and call 311 to schedule a pick-up.

- The leaf bags will be col-

lected within two business days of your call to 311.

- Weather conditions or the volume of leaves in a particular area may cause the planned schedule to change.

- This list of pick-up locations will be updated daily by 3 p.m.

Call the Leaf Hotline at 427-2302 for a daily update or if you have questions contact the citizens Services Center at 311.

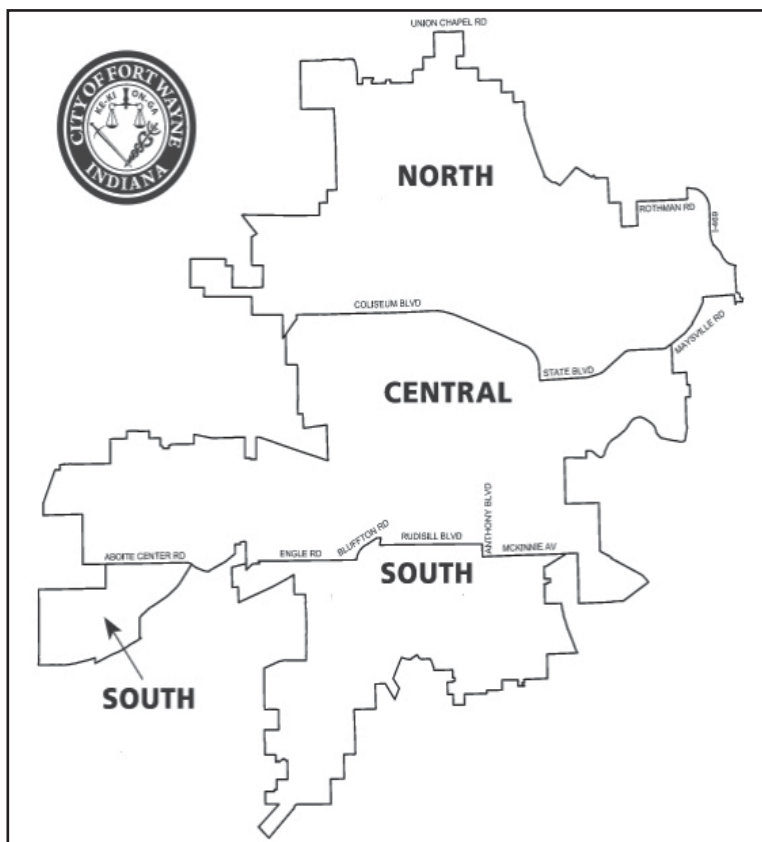

## What Is A Cool Season Crop and why

A cool season crop is exactly what you think it is, a plant that thrives in cooler temperatures (70° F – 21°C or below) and can survive a light frost.

Cool season vegetables grow best at temperatures averaging 15° cooler than those needed by warm season types.

These early vegetables not only withstand cold temperatures, but they also need them to germinate, grow, set fruit, and mature.

Some winter-hardy vegeta-

bles, such as kale or Brussels sprouts, even benefit from a light frost, as it converts the starches into sugar. By increasing sugar within their cells, the cool season plants are protected from freezing. This is great news for us because those increased sugars make these veggies even more delicious.

Since the date to start is different for each plant, check the seed packet, catalog, or planting guide in your garden

journal for the number of days from frost, for planting.

To get your average last frost date in your area, you can check (if you are in the US) the USDA growing zone map.

Each crop's planting date can be anytime from a couple of weeks to a couple of months before the last frost date. These crops are often further divided into hardy and semi-hardy categories, depending upon their ability to withstand cold temperatures.

# Fire Department offers reminder to avoid open burning

As the leaves begin to fall from the trees, people look for ways to remove them. For those considering burning leaves, twigs or trash that have accumulated on their lawns, the Fort Wayne Fire Department reminds everyone to avoid open burning as a general rule.

FWFD Fire Marshal Jim Murua says, "No one is to kindle or maintain open burning consisting of a trash fire, leaf fire, refuse fire, or other open burning according to Fort Wayne City Code."

He explains that there are two exemptions allowed under certain conditions:

1. Bonfire celebrating school pep rallies are on exemption which requires obtaining a Burn Permit from FWFD at least 24 hours in advance of the permitted open burning. Call 427-1102 for more information or with questions.

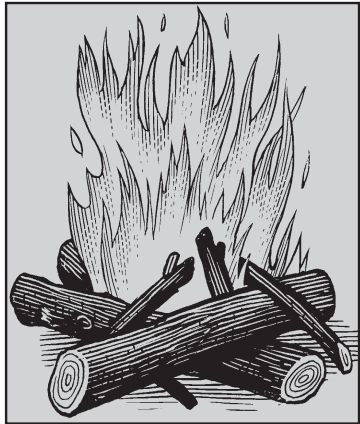
2. Recreational camp fires for scouting or family cookout activities are allowed without a permit and a subject to the conditions listed below.

These exemptions must be subject to the following:

- A garden hose connected to a water supply, buckets, shovel, fire extinguisher or other approved fire-extinguishing equipment shall be readily available at the burn site.

- Only wood products shall be burned. No leaves, paper or trash.

- A fire shall be attended by a responsible party at all times until completely extinguished.



- A fire shall be located at least 25 feet away from any structure, fence or right of way.

- A fire shall not exceed an area three feet wide by two feet high.

- Anyone who recklessly, knowingly or intentionally kindles, or maintains any open burning consisting of a trash fire, leaf fire, bonfire, refuse fire, or other open burning that damages property of another person may be liable for criminal mischief.

- Any person who maintains burning of combustible materials out of doors or open burning not permitted shall be in violation and may be fined \$50. If the violator does not appear in response to a notice issued to them within a period of 30 calendar days from the date and time shown on the notice, the penalty shall be \$75. Repeat violators will be fined.

Please take the extra necessary to exercise safety at all times.

## PREPARING FOR FALLING RAIN AND LEAVES



### NEIGHBORS HELPING NEIGHBORS

Sometimes heavy rains can totally overwhelm Fort Wayne's storm sewer system. In autumn, falling leaves can block storm drain inlets causing standing water and localized flooding even during smaller rain storms. You and your neighbors can protect your property and help ensure that emergency and other vehicles have access to your neighborhood by doing the following:

**KEEP THE DRAINS CLEAR**

1. Be a good neighbor and remove leaves and other debris from the gutters and storm sewer inlets near your home before it rains. This helps in several ways:
  - Helps prevent street flooding during future rain storms
  - Keeps your neighborhood looking tidy and well maintained
2. If you notice that your street is flooding, clear accumulated leaves and debris from storm sewer inlets to keep the water flowing.
3. Manage yard waste properly by keeping it out of the street and storm drain.
4. Never pour chemicals, grease, oil, paint or any other fluids down storm sewers.

Fort Wayne's Street Department employees will be picking up leaves and will clean leaves off the streets this fall. But the City also relies on your efforts as a good neighbor to reduce flooding and protect property in your neighborhood.
