### PRESIDENT'S STATE OF THE ASSOCIATION

Arlington Park is 51 years old! Let's face it. We all get older and our neighborhood is no exception. But, with age comes experience, wisdom and a healthy dose of restraint.

Arlington Park Neighborhood has matured well because our members and Board of Directors, working hand in hand with our Executive Director, Janie Baker, and an extraordinary staff, have thoughtfully relied on past experience, wisdom gained from past successes and failures and a mindful attitude toward balance in preserving amenities and change for the better.

With over 1100 homes, there are a lot of opinions about how a neighborhood should be run and how a neighborhood should mature. I think we all agree that we want our neighborhood to age gracefully, to get better with age and to continue to change in directions that make raising a family here the ideal.

Recently I saw what I believe to be a great outlook on change reflected in Alayna Hackert's News and Views board candidacy introduction. She wrote, "The 80/20 rule is something I value and strive for. Eighty percent of a long established and smoothly running system should be kept in place and twenty percent should be ever evolving to help Arlington Park grow into an even better community." I think this is a reflection shared by our board as a whole and our members as well. I see evolution in changes such as the addition of more Pickleball Courts over the last two years, Pickleball instruction, the introduction of the GAGA ball pit, and in the introduction of new events, like the Doggie Paddle at season end for the pool. The importance of updating, preserving and maintaining the amenities that have served us well over the years is also evident. This year, capital funds were used for replacing much needed items, such as the pool liner, filter grids for the pools, flooring for the clubhouse, drainage repair, equipment replacement, security, and neighborhood updates and enhancement in common areas. The board utilizes a long-term budget to set aside for expenditures that occur over a 10-year period.

The dedication of staff, part and full time, to maintenance and enhancement of common grounds, amenities and equipment translates into property values that

have maintained and increased over these many years. Even after 51 years we see articles in local publications highlighting our neighborhood as a premier location to raise a family. According to Trulia online, "Arlington Park has to be one of the most family friendly neighborhoods in all of Indiana."

Multiple panels of experience and expertise provide answers to homeowners and board members. As necessary, the board seeks direction from the Architectural Control Committee, the Legal Panel, Security, neighborhood liaisons, city and county offices and elected officials. We have strong relationships with a number of offices and individuals in our city and county government that we are able to direct homeowners to when needed. These relationships also are key to accomplishing some projects, such as street repair, ditch maintenance and safety improvements.

The last couple of years have been a struggle logistically to accomplish our goals of keeping our dues under the cost of living and inflation increases as the effects of the job market, ever increasing costs of goods, supplies and labor have affected all of us individually, as employees, business owners, homeowners and as a neighborhood. The Arlington Park Board and Executive Director have succeeded in keeping our dues increase in line with and below the increases experienced in other areas of our lives. As always, this year, emphasis was duly placed on maximizing income potential through our golf club, pool memberships and clubhouse rental. We have budgeted carefully for the necessary expenses and enhancements to keep our neighborhood an attractive place to live in and raise a family, while maintaining property and equipment to last beyond the suggested lifespan so that our members have strong property values, and dues that reflect thorough attention to budgeting by your Board of Directors.

Special thanks to our Executive Director, Janie Baker, our dedicated staff and department heads, our Legal Panel, Architectural Control Committee, neighborhood liaisons and our Board of Directors for all the work you do throughout the year for our members.



### St. Patrick's Day HISTORY

# Lines From The Links

End of February and the winter has been on the mild side except for the arctic blast during Christmas. March 15 is right around the corner so if we can skip the crazy spring snow storms the golf season may get an early start.

The Golf Shop, as always, will be opening on Wednesday, March 15th. The course will then open as weather permits.

With everyone anxious to be outside and enjoying the nice weather, just a few reminders to keep in mind.

When there is a frost on the ground please stay off the course including practice putting green.

Ground being saturated can lead to flooding conditions with just a small amount of rain. Never go into the flooded areas, with drains and creeks in the low areas, some spots can drop off

with no warning.

Springtime maintenance means some familiar areas may need roped off or have signage designating areas to avoid. Allowing the ground to recover from damage over the winter.

Memberships and league registration will be available in the golf shop during normal hours. Also the clubhouse is able to answer questions regarding memberships.

All members should sign in at the golf shop before playing.

We may have a few days where the weather can be great but the course is covered with standing water, please refrain from playing. This can only do additional damage.

Once the course has firmed up all the areas roped off should be observed and avoided.

Last summer I widened the

fairways, mowed the rough substantially shorter and maintained the turf surrounding the greens at such a level the chipping should have been much easier. In order to continue this program everyone should be observant of where they are going, especially while driving a golf car.

Great golfing to everyone this season.

## Before you begin: A note from Architectural Control

Arlington Park Community Association Architectural Control Guidelines and Policy.

In order to maintain harmonious structural design and lot grades, the Board of Directors of the Arlington Park Community Association has adopted the following architectural Control Guidelines and Policy to be followed by the Architectural Control Committee in its review and approval for improvements to property within Arlington Park as provided by the restrictive covenants of the various sections of Arlington Park.

Accessory Building: Where permitted by restrictive covenant, an accessory building should not exceed 144 square feet in the area and ten feet in height above grade. The building's exterior color, siding and roofing materials shall be the same as the dwelling on the lot. The accessory building may not be within an easement per the Arlington Park Covenants and Bylaws and the City Zoning Ordinance. The City Zoning requires

that an Improvement Location Permit be applied for an issued. Placement of the detached accessory shed located behind a residential structure shall use the following set backs: for interior lots at least 3' (feet) from side and rear property lines and for corner lots no less than the platted side yard setback.

Fences: No wire, metal or chain link fences will be permitted, however, a small woven wire fence may be used in conjunction with a split rail or similar fence in a side or rear yard to contain a pet. The Board recognizes that many residents may wish to erect a fence within an easement. While the Architectural Control committee may approve a fence for design purposes, the property owner must assume all responsibility for providing unobstructed access to the easement for utility purposes. Moreover, the expense of removing or replacing a fence within an easement is the sole responsibility of the property owner.

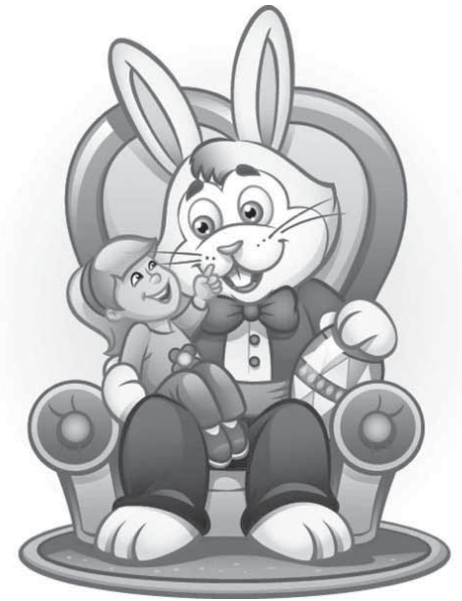

**Playground Equipment:** Plans for playground equipment, basketball courts, etc. shall be submitted to the Architectural Control Committee for review so as to assure compliance with yard requirements. Equipment that becomes unsightly because of lack of maintenance, repair or use should be removed.

**Dog Runs and Kennels:** dog-houses, kennels or dog runs shall not be allowed or approved. No area within a front, side or rear yard shall be enclosed or fenced so as to provide a run for a dog. However, this requirement does not preclude a resident from fencing an entire yard and permitting a pet to run therein.

**Antennas and Satellite Receivers:** No free-standing antennas or television satellite receivers shall be permitted on any lot. When allowed by restrictive covenant, an antenna or receiver not exceeding 30 square feet in area or 6 feet above the highest point of the roof area may be attached to the dwelling or receiver not exceeding 30 square feet in area of 6 feet above the highest point of the roof area may be attached to the dwelling.
