ANNUAL MEETING

The 2023 Annual Meeting of the Arlington Park Association was held February 21, 2023, at the Arlington Park Clubhouse. Association President Lynda Gevers called the meeting to order at 7:33 p.m.

Those in attendance were: John Knipp, Harlan Altena, Bruce Westendorf, Robert Gevers II, Tom Thomson, Alayna Hackert, Shaunnette Mildred and Executive Director Janie Baker.

The first order of business was reading of minutes from the 2022 Annual Meeting by Vice President, Bruce Westendorf.

The Treasurer's Report was given by Harlan Altena as follows:

Review of the 2023 cash on hand and 2022 long term expenditures was given as follows:

- 2023 prepaid dues were \$149,265.00 or 18% of budgeted compared to 19% in 2022.

- Cash Reserves \$463,159.84, account receivable at year end was \$28,052.66 including payment arrangements. Fourteen families are past due-two are deceased and in probate.

- Dues paid as of February 1st, 2023 was \$375,720.00 or 45%.

- Operations Budget Ac-

tual Expenses in 2022 were \$950,088.05 with a cost of living of 6%. The Operations Budget Expenses set for 2023 are:

- \$1,025,660 with a cost of living of 8.6%.

- Long Term Golf Expenditures included:

- Golf: John Deere Precision Cut mower \$41,091. Kabota ATV Maintenance vehicle \$21,345.

- Pool: Progressive pool PVC liner \$84,450. New Furnace for Lap Pool \$26,590. Diving Board Resurface \$5,535.

- Sidewalks: Removal and repair/replacement \$65,673.

- Playgrounds: Gaga Ball pit, SpaceShuttle, Pickleball \$6,500.

- Drainage Repairs: Sagimore and Quincy Court \$27,187.

- Arlington remains in good financial standing.

Lynda Gevers introduced John Knipp, Committee Election Chairman, who announced this year's results for the Annual Election as follows: Candidates elected for three year terms listed in alphabetical order are: Alayna Hackert, Kyle Lehman and Bruce Westendorf. Congratulations!

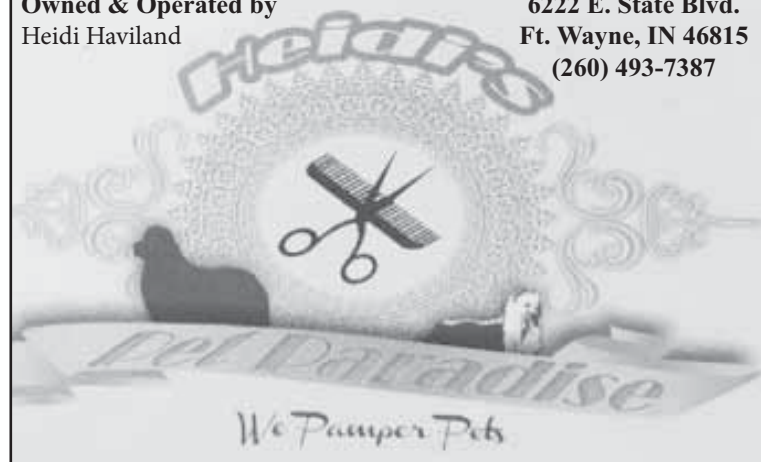

ITEMS THAT SHOULD NOT BE IN SEWERS:

Keep the storm drains open during our April showers. Please pick up any debris in the street especially around storm drains to allow for the water to flow and keep flooding to a minimum.

Catch basins and sewer inlets are for rainwater and melting snow only. Crews from the City of Fort Wayne's Water Pollution Control Maintenance Department, the department responsible for cleaning catch basins and storm sewer inlets, recently pulled a number of unusual items out of some City sewers including: boots, cellular telephones, VCRs, realtor signs, buckets and file cabinet drawers.

These items should NOT be put into storm sewer inlets.

The only thing that should ever go into a storm sewer is rainwater or melting snow.

NEVER PUT ANY OF THESE ITEMS INTO A STORM SEWER INLET:

Automobile fluids like oil or anti-freeze, leaves, sand or topsoil, grass clippings or other yard wastes, scrap lumber or any chemicals.

Clogged catch basins and inlets can cause many problems including odors, street flooding, even injury to maintenance employees.

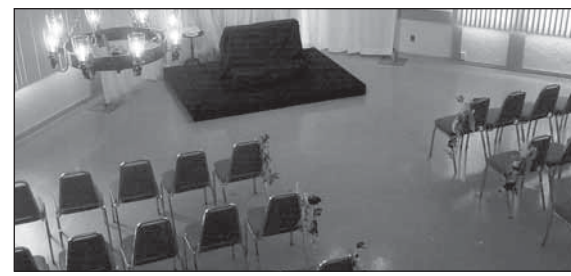
In addition, children should NEVER play in or around storm sewer inlets or manholes. For storm or sanitary sewer questions or emergencies, please call 311.

Call Before You Dig!

As homeowners you may be purchasing Internet and/or phone services with all of the NEW technology now being offered. This will require companies to dig in our neighborhood. Because Arlington has an elaborate system of greenway lights running behind the homes, this poses a possible predicament.

We are asking all residents planning to add new service or replace old service to give us a call at the clubhouse at 486-1967 or email us: Info@arlingtonpark.net. Before you dig! Arlingtons electrician will locate all of our underground lines free of charge. All we ask is 72 hours notification before the digging is to begin. Remember, Don't Dig Blind!

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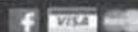

GUIDELINES FOR ROLL-OFF CONTAINERS AND TRUCKS

Neighborhood Cleanup Program Guidelines for Roll-Off Containers and Trucks. Materials that cannot be put into the container/truck include:

***Latex paint cans need to be dried out before placing in the container. We cannot accept paint in a liquid form because it may leak out onto the ground or street.

Cleanups are from 8 a.m. to noon. Containers will be delivered by 8 a.m. and picked up between noon and 2 p.m. on the

same day.

Do Not Overfill the container. Debris must not hang over the sides or stick up higher than the sides of the container, and the door must be able to close.

The neighborhood is responsible for the container. If it is overfilled, the neighborhood will be responsible for leveling off the container prior to pickup. If unacceptable items are placed in the container, the neighborhood is responsible for removal and disposal of the

item(s).

No Rain Date for Containers/trucks. We will not be able to pick up containers and deliver them on another day if it is raining. If there is thunder and lightning, DO NOT, under any circumstances, try to do your cleanup.

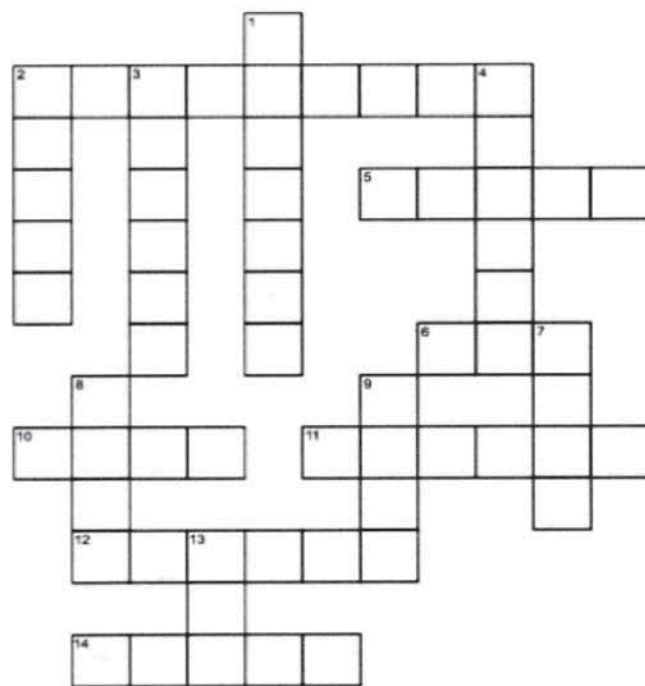

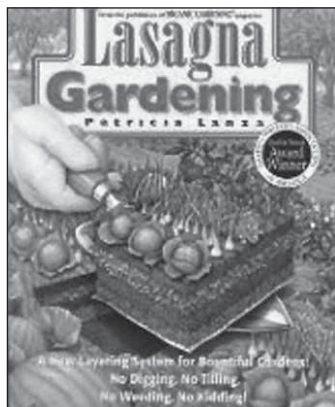

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**RAISED BED SOIL RECIPE
by Ricky**



This recipe uses tricks from a wide variety of garden methods such as permaculture, hugelculture, biochar and bio-dynamic, just to name a few. Starting from the bottom to top:

Layers of newspaper or cardboard

Layer of 1/4 to 1/2 mesh hardware cloth to keep critters at bay.

Layer of small twigs and branches from or any tree except a walnut. This is a version of hugelculture.

4-6 inch layer of leaves of any tree except walnut, maple leaves are best.

Scatter charcoal from a wood fire or scrape charcoal from burned wood over the leaves. Biochar method.

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
