ITEMS THAT SHOULD NOT BE IN SEWERS:

Catch basins and sewer inlets are for rainwater and melting snow only. Crews from the City of Fort Wayne's Water Pollution Control Maintenance Department, the department responsible for cleaning catch basins and storm sewer inlets, recently pulled a number of unusual items out of some City sewers including: boots, cellular telephones, VCRs, realtor signs, buckets and file cabinet drawers.

These items should NOT be put into storm sewer inlets.

The only thing that should ever go into a storm sewer is rainwater or melting snow.

NEVER PUT ANY OF THESE ITEMS INTO A STORM SEWER INLET:

Automobile fluids like oil or anti-freeze, leaves, sand or topsoil, grass clippings or other yard wastes, scrap lumber or any chemicals.

Clogged catch basins and inlets can cause many problems including odors, street flooding, even injury to maintenance employees.

In addition, children should NEVER play in or around storm sewer inlets or manholes. For storm or sanitary sewer questions or emergencies, please call 311.

Fishing

Fishing is permitted in the lake areas of Brittany Village, Shenandoah Circle and Lake Crystal. Because we are privately owned a fishing license is not required.

The current harvesting rule is: No size limit on Bluegill, but Bass must be a minimum of 14 inches long to keep or they must be returned to the lake.

2. Fishing equipment must be picked up when leaving.

3. No motor boats of any kind are allowed.

As members of the community you have use of the tables and chairs for 72 hours, a total deposit of \$10 is charged. The deposit is returned once the tables and chairs are brought back to the clubhouse.

Please plan to have help available to load and unload tables and chairs as needed.

I. It is incumbent upon the members of the Pool Advisory Committee to do the following:

• Review and make recommendations to the Arlington Board of Directors concerning, but not limited to, policies, procedures, and rules involving the operation and utilization of the swimming pool facilities, as well as the construction, renovation, and/or any major capital.

• Review and make recommendations to the Arlington Board of Directors concerning, but not limited to, the budget for the pool facilities, including all expenditures and income, as well as the hiring of all pool personnel.

II. The membership of the Pool Advisory Committee shall consist of eight (8) Association members, and shall be originally appointed by the Arlington Board of Directors. Members will serve two year terms, and will be eligible for reappointment. Terms will exist on a calendar year basis.

The members of the Pool Advisory Committee will elect a chairperson, who will serve one year and will be eligible for reappointment.

Any vacancies on the Pool Advisory Committee will be filled by a simple majority vote of the Committee members, with a quorum of five members required.

* A mandatory restbreak is enforced 15 minutes on the hour.

ALL RESIDENTS AND THEIR GUESTS ARE WELCOME

The Arlington Park Pool Rules apply to all individuals (residents and/or guests) without regard to age, gender, race, disability and/or natioanl origin, pursuant to all Federal, State and Local status, laws and ordinances.

POOL SAFETY COMES FIRST!

1. Members must have ID tags to be admitted to the pool area. All guests <u>MUST</u> be accompanied by an Arlington Park Member. Guest Fees: \$5 per adult and \$3.00 per child per day. Ask about our 3 and 7

day passes. The association is not responsible for lost or stolen items.

2. Individuals under the age of 12 or unable to be responsible for themselves must be accompanied by a responsible person 12 or over to gain entrance to the inside pool area. Non-adult members over the age of 12 and under the age of 21, may bring up to 3 guests in a visit.

3. Swimmers must pass a proficiency test (*See:* Red Band Rule section of document) in order to swim in any area ofthe lap/sports pool and/or deep end of the multi depth pool. NON SWIMMERS ARE NOT ALLOWED IN THE LAP/SPORTS POOL AND/OR DEEP END OF THE MULTI-DEPTH POOL. In addition, individuals wishing to use the 3 meter diving board also must meet the height requirement of 4 ft. or taller. Swim test may be administered to any member or guest at the discretion of the Lifeguards to ensure safe swimming for our members and guests.

4. THE WADING POOL IS FOR NON-SWIMMING INDIVIDUALS ONLY. Safe conduct and maximum occupancy is strictly enforced. Lifeguards are not provided in the wading pool; parents, guardians or a responsible individual must stay with non-swimming individuals in this pool to ensure safety.

5. U.S. Coast Guard approved personal flotation devices are permitted in the two shallow areas of the multi depth pool and the wading pool.

6. A rest break will be observed each hour for patrons under 18 other than individuals participating in a scheduled class or activity.

7. Diving is permitted in designated areas ONLY. 8. Lap lanes are reserved for proficient lap swimmers.

9. Eating and drinking in designated areas ONLY. No alcoholic beverages or glass permitted during regular pool hours. **NO COOLER PERMITTED.**

10. Pushing, running on the pool deck, profanity, vulgar remarks or misconduct shall not be permitted. Lifeguards have full authority to enforce rules.

11. Appropriate swim attire required. No street clothing or cutoffs. Dressing or undressing is restricted to the bathroom areas.

12. Incontinent individuals must wear approved swim diapers or plastic swim pants with tightly fitting elastic at the waist and leg openings. The Center for Disease Control (CDC) recommends diapers be checked and changed at least every 60 minutes and we request our members and guests adhere to this recommendation. There shall be no pool side changing of diapers, however, individuals may use the restroom areas. Proper, sanitary disposal of swim diapers is required.

13. NO PETS PERMITTED! Approved 11/2/2020. BOD

RULES AND REGULATIONS DIVING BOARD RULES

A swim proficiency test is required for all children under the age of 9 using the diving boards. (see Red Band Rule)

Children under the age of 9 must pass the Red

Band proficiency test and be at least 4 ft. tall to use the 1 meter or the 3 meter diving board – FOR THE SAFETY OF OUR MEMBERS AND GUESTS THERE ARE NO EXCEPTION TO THIS RULE!

Patrons must wait at the bottom of the ladder for their turn, taking care not to interfere with the divers.

Only one diver at a time is permitted on the board.

The diving board is the only entrance to the diving area in the pool.

Recreational divers must jump or dive using only one bounce. No running off the end of the board, handstands, sitting or back dives are permitted.

Only jumping and diving straight off the end of the board is permitted.

All divers must carefully observe the diving well and wait until the previous diver has cleared the area before diving.

Immediately after diving, the diver must surface and swim clear of the diving area.

All diving board equipment may be adjusted by Aquatic personnel ONLY. Any activities deems unsafe by the Aquatics personnel are not permitted. Only one diving board may be in operation at any time in one pool facility.

- All current animal license is required for entry. Current licenses from other cities and counties will be honored. It is the responsibility of the owner/handler to provide proof of current license and current rables vaccination upon entry.
- 2. Dogs will be allowed to be off-leash on the pool deck only.
- Dogs should be allowed ample time to relieve themselves prior to entering the pool area. Owners/handlers must clean up after their dogs (bags and receptacles are provided).
- 4. By completing this form I am agreeing that to the best of my knowledge, my dog has never had altercations with other dogs and is dog, people, and child-friendly. Aggressive dogs are not allowed. Owners/handlers of any dog(s) exhibiting aggressive or unruly behavior will be required to immediately remove the offending animal.
- 5. There must be one owner/handler for every dog admitted.

Signature:

- Owner/handlers must be over 18 years of age. Children under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult.
- 7. All ages of dogs are welcome. Dogs over the age of 6 months must be spayed or neutered.
- Dog owners/handlers are both personally and legally responsible for their animals. You are using this facility at your own risk and are personally and legally responsible for the actions of your dog(s).
 An action that are considered by staff to be useful actionally and legally responsible for the actions of your dog(s).
- Any actions that are considered by staff to be unsafe, potentially dangerous, injurious, or nonbeneficial to guests and dogs will not be allowed.
- 10. No toys or balls are allowed to doggie paddle day this year (dog life preservers are allowed).
- 11. Humans are not allowed to be in the pool (lifeguards are permitted).
- 12. Masks or face shields are required as social distancing with those outside of your immediate family.

School bus safety tips for drivers and children

Every school day 23 million children ride a big yellow bus. While school buses are one of the safest models of transport, there are real risks in getting on and off and walking to bus stops. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) has offered some tips to help students, parents and motorists be safe around buses. **Tips for Drivers:**

When backing out of a driveway or leaving a garage, watch out for children walking or bicycling to school. Better yet, walk around your car or out to the sidewalk to check for any children walking your path before you get in.

Drive slowly and watch for children walking in the street, especially if there are no sidewalks. Also be aware of children playing or waiting around bus stops.

Be alert and aware on the road. While children are typically taught about looking both ways, they could dart into the street without looking if they are late or distracted.

Learn the school bus laws in your state. Yellow flashing lights indicate that the bus is preparing to stop to pickup or drop off children. Drivers need to slow down and prepare to stop. Red flashing lights and an extended stop arm signal indicate that he bus is stopped and that children are getting on or off. Cars must stop a safe distance away and not proceed until the red lights stop flashing, the stop signs folds back and the bus continues on its way.

Tips for children:

Get to the bus stop at least five minutes before the bus is scheduled to arrive.

When the bus approaches, stand at least 6 feet away from the curb, and line up away from the street.

Wait until the bus stops, the door opens and the driver says that it's okay before stepping onto the bus.

If you have to cross the street in front of the bus, walk on the he sidewalk to a point at least 10 feet ahead of the bus before you cross. Be sure that the bus driver can see you and you can see the bus driver.

Use the handrails to avoid falls. When exiting the bus, be careful that clothing or backpacks don't get caught in the handrails or doors.

Never walk behind the bus.

If you drop something near the bus, tell the bus driver. Never try to pick it up because the driver may not be able to see you.

In attendance: Executive Director Janie Baker, President Lynda Gevers, Vice President Bruce Westendorf, Secretary Kyle Lehman by Proxy, Alayna Hackert, Sarah Garman, Shaunnette Mildred and roger Hubart. Guests Bob Gevers and Eric Armbruster.

The meeting was called to order by Lynda Gevers, President, at 6:02 p.m.

Special Guest Eric Armbruster discussed a proposal for the wooded common ground area between Laurel Hurst and Creek Ridge Place. Without as built surveys provided or required from 1986, moving towards a resolve for drainage issues were suggested. A presentation, including 720 lineal feet of 6" dual tile installed with 7 catch basins through the wooded area was recommended upon approval of the Allen County Surveyor. A motion was made and approved to move forward with the project, not to exceed \$19,000 for the installation as the early as August of 2023.

Motion to approve June Board Minutes made, seconded, and passed.

Janie reviewed a request for the modification of our current policy for the family and adult swim hour. The Board discussed options. A poll via the website will be issued for homeowners to vote.

The age study completed and confirmed 845 children in Arlington. Age groupings respectively. The study is utilized to determine upgrades and modifications to play areas.

A new social event, Painting

Janie gave the treasurers report in Harlan's absence. Ninetynine percent of dues have been collected through the end of June. \$114,238.63 in long term expenditures to date. In June the color coating on Tennis Court 1-2-3-4 and 5 was completed. The merrygo-round in Saucer Park has been installed.

Committee for Pool Expansion: Bruce gave a presentation of ideas and concepts to the board including parking expansion, water slides and features, increased seating areas and other conveniences with a focus on engaging all age groups. It was noted that splash pads need frequent high maintenance.

A motion to initiate a policy for video surveillance. Upon review it was adopted that only authorized staff or law enforcement would have access to the video to protect member privacy and safety. Motion was seconded and approved.

Janie began the annual tour with the Board of Directors to review the current assets in Arlington to include buildings, pools, equipment, ponds, play areas, golf course, bridges and grounds. Next scheduled meeting will

be Aug. 7, 2023 at 6 p.m.
