The current harvesting rule is: No size limit on Bluegill, but Bass must be a minimum of 14 inches long to keep or they must be returned to the lake.

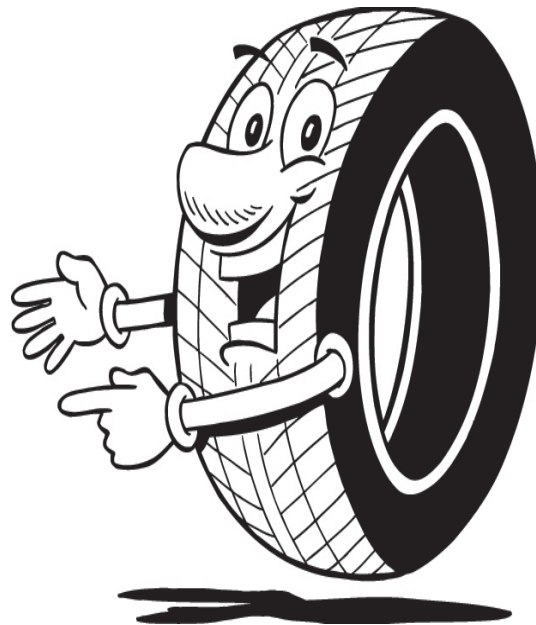

Grabill Annual County Fair set for Sept. 7-9



This popular annual festival, which attracts 100,000 visitors, began in 1973 by the Grabill Chamber of Commerce. Grabill is a quaint town of about 1,000 people, just north of Fort Wayne, Indiana nestled in the heart of a large Amish community. The town's country-style fair highlights the area's Amish heritage.

The first country fair consisted of a joint community church service and fellowship. Since then the event has expanded to become one of the finest craft fairs. Held on the Thursday, Friday and Saturday after Labor

Day, the fair encompasses streets lined with tents and canopies, which shelter 130 craft booths.

Among crafts are those that showcase the natural beauty of wood, which include shelves, frames, and board games; other works highlight needlepoint, knitting and crocheting projects. Dolls, ceramic villages, blown glass objects, lampshades, and whirlybirds are also among craft items offered.

Also crafts of a bygone era are demonstrated, such as the use of the spinning wheel, or making cornhusk dolls, or horse-

shoeing Activities and contests run nonstop. Children can participate in a spelling bee, or old-fashion contests, which include frog jumping, a baby crawl, jump rope, apple peeling, watermelon eating, and cherry pit spitting. Men can enter nail driving or cross-cut sawing contests; and women can enter apple pie baking.

Gospel music is performed on Saturday evening, and country and bluegrass is played at other times. County fare, such as apple dumplings and corn on the cob provide sustenance.

ARLINGTON PARK'S DOGGIE PADDLE DAY RULES

1. All current animal license is required for entry. Current licenses from other cities and counties will be honored. It is the responsibility of the owner/handler to provide proof of current license and current rabies vaccination upon entry.
2. Dogs will be allowed to be off-leash on the pool deck only.
3. Dogs should be allowed ample time to relieve themselves prior to entering the pool area. Owners/handlers must clean up after their dogs (bags and receptacles are provided).
4. By completing this form I am agreeing that to the best of my knowledge, my dog has never had altercations with other dogs and is dog, people, and child-friendly. Aggressive dogs are not allowed. Owners/handlers of any dog(s) exhibiting aggressive or unruly behavior will be required to immediately remove the offending animal.
5. There must be one owner/handler for every dog admitted.
6. Owner/handlers must be over 18 years of age. Children under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult.
7. All ages of dogs are welcome. Dogs over the age of 6 months must be spayed or neutered.
8. Dog owners/handlers are both personally and legally responsible for their animals. You are using this facility at your own risk and are personally and legally responsible for the actions of your dog(s).
9. Any actions that are considered by staff to be unsafe, potentially dangerous, injurious, or non-beneficial to guests and dogs will not be allowed.
10. No toys or balls are allowed to doggie paddle day this year (dog life preservers are allowed).
11. Humans are not allowed to be in the pool (lifeguards are permitted).
12. Masks or face shields are required as social distancing with those outside of your immediate family.

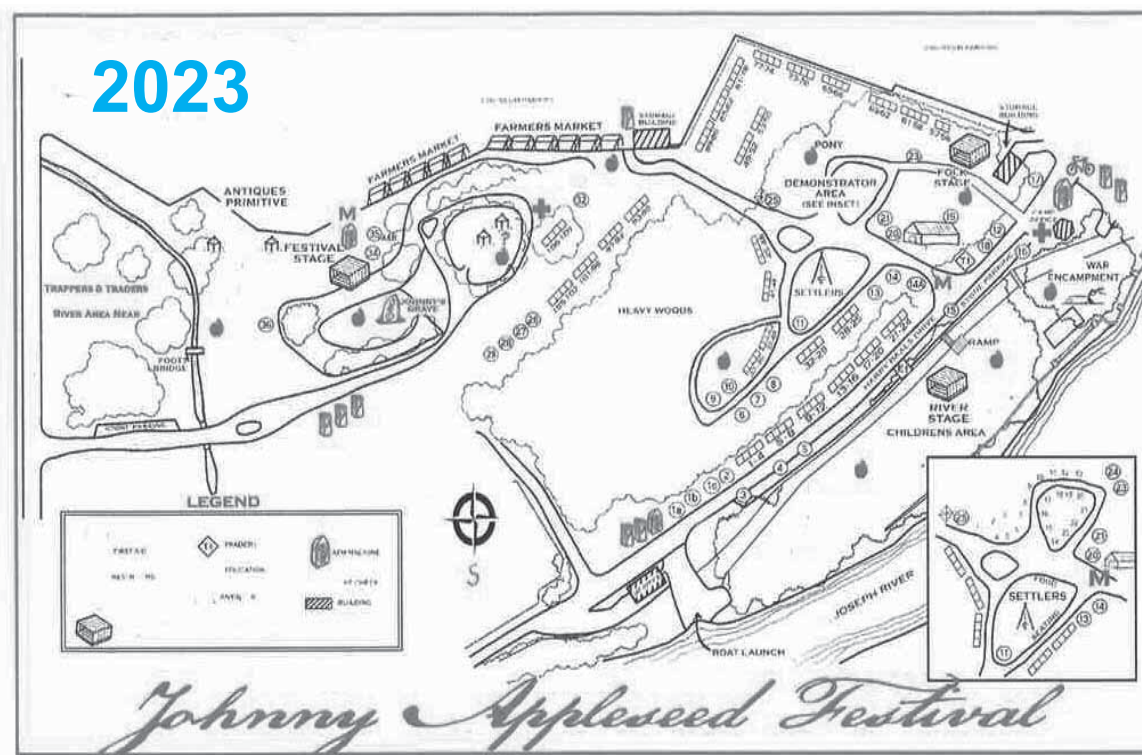

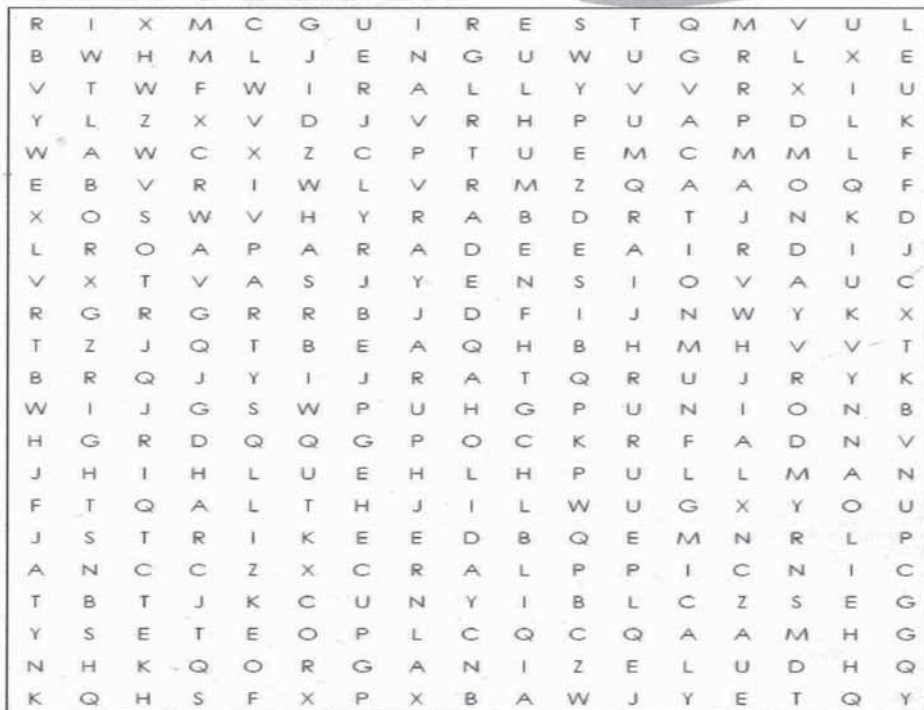
