#### Winter advice for Arlington residents

Keep your yard lights on all night. If you have autos parked in the driveway, have nothing valuable inside and keep them locked up.

When we have a forecast for snow, please keep cars off the street so that the plows can make their way through.

There are  $(\tilde{3})$  levels of snow emergency:

LEVEL 1: Roadways are hazardous with blowing and drifting snow. Roads may able be icy. Drive carefully.

LEVEL 2: roadways are hazardous with blowing and drifting snow. Only those who feel it is necessary to drive should be out on the roads. Contact your employer to see if you should report to work.

LEVEL 3: All roadways are closed to non-emergency personnel. No one else should be out during these conditions unless it is absolutely necessary to travel or a personal emergency exists. All employees should contact their employer to see if they should report to work. Those traveling on the roads may subject themselves to arrest.

Officially, the National Weather Service defines a blizzard as large amounts of falling OR blowing snow with winds to excess of 35 mph and visibility of less than 1/4 of a mile for an extended period of time (greater than 3 hours). German settlers in Iowa originally coined the word blizzard, coming from the word blitzartig, meaning "Lightninglike." European pioneers and settlers were astounded by the severity of the winters in the New World. Although accustomed to snow in their homelands, they were newly confronted with driving winds and freezing temperatures characteristic of Snowbelt regions.

In the December issue of *Arlington News and Views*, the top was "remember when" and I found it very interesting when reading about our past. It really puts thing in perspective and we can all realize that it takes a collective effort by all that got us where we are now.

(Did you know we have approximately 45 families that have lived in Arlington for 30 years or more?

## **Snowmobiling...Not Permitted**

#### Indiana Snowmobile Laws

14-1-3.5-15 Operations Restrictions Sec. 15: A person shall not operate a snowmobile:

1. At a rate of speed greater than is reasonable and proper having due regard for conditions that exist.

2. While under the influence of an intoxicating liquor or unlawfully under the influence of a narcotic or other habit forming or dangerous depressant or stimulant drug.

3. During the hours from onehalf (1/2) hour after sunset to one-half (1/2) hour before sunrise without displaying a lighted headlight and a lighted taillight.

4. In any nursey, planting area, or public lands posted or reasonably identified as an area of forest or plant reproduction and when growing stock may be damaged.

5. On the frozen surface of

public waters within one hundred (100) feet of a fishing shanty or shelter except at a speed of five (5) miles per hour or less.

6. Unless equipped with a muffler in good working order and in constan operation to prevent excessive or unusual noise and annoying smoke.

7. Within one hundred (100) feet of a dwelling between 12 midnight and 6 a.m., except on his own property or property under his control or as an invited guest.

8. On any property without the consent of the landowner or tenant thereof.

9. While transporting thereon a bow unless unstrung, or a firearm unless unloaded and security encased or equipped with and made inoperative by a manufactured key locked trigger housing mechanism.

10. On or across a cemetery or



burial ground.

11. Within one hundred (100) feet of a slide, ski or skating area, except for the purpose of servicing the area.

12. On a railroad track or railroad right-of-way, except railroad personnel in performance of their duties.

13. On public property unless authorized to do so.

The meeting was called to order by Lynda Gevers, President at 6 p.m.

• Motion to approve October Board Minutes made, seconded. and passed.

• Rick Samek, Architectural Committee member, gave an update. A time for Questions and answers was provided for new Board members. ## **Neighborhood Leaf Pickup to be announced**

Leaves are beginning to change color and fall, so Fort Wayne Street Department crews are gearing up for leaf collection.

Collections will occur two times in each of the city's more than 400 neighborhoods, with the last week of collection starting in December.

For curbside leaf pick-up residents should rake leaves to the curb or park strip in front of their home, but not into the street. Leaves should be in the park strip by 7 a.m. on Monday of the week the leaves are to be collected for your area. Other yard waste should not be mixed with the leaves.

Residents can access daily collection updates at cityoffortwayne.org/leaves. There they will find a neighborhood schedule updated daily, collection map and general leaf collection information. This daily update will soon and residents can call 427-2603 for daily updates.

You can also schedule a pick-

up if you place your leaves in biodegradable bags by calling 311. The bags should be placed at the curb and will be collected within two business days of the call.

Don't put leaves in your trash or recycling cart. This is against state law, and burning leaves is a violation of city code and can result in a fine. Don't place leaves in or over storm drains. Parents should remind children to not play in leaf piles near the street.
