I realize that change is never easy, especially when someone has been in this particular position as Executive Director for 40 years. In saying that, I want to express my sincerest gratitude to you, the residents of Arlington Park. I appreciate your patience and grace as I have navigated through the complexities and challenges of overseeing such a large thriving Community.

This past year brought some major challenges, specifically as it related to the maintenance of our pools. As we all know, they are 50 years old which brought about some unforeseen issues. I want to thank you for your patience as we met those issues head on. Listed below are a few helpful suggestions from our Architechural Committee.

New Paint: Homeowners are free to repaint their homes using a color identical to the existing paint.

Roof Treatment: When a home requires a new roof, homeowners are free to re-roof their homes using the identical color and type of shingle found on the existing home.

Antennas and Satellite Dishes: Satellite dishes are required to be less than 36 inches in diameter to be placed at the rear of the house, not visible from the street and to be screened from view from the neighbors.

Play Equipment and Toys: Arlington Park is a family community so children are an important part of our community. In order to maintain harmony

children's toys should be stored indoors or in an orderly fashion that they are screened part of the backyard not visible from public view. Bicycles and other riding toys should be kept in the garage when not in use. No play structure or equipment is allowed in the common areas.

Swimming pools: Portable swimming pools are prohibited in the covenants. A child pool that can be emptied and stored every evening, out of sight, is permitted.

Lighting: Tasteful accent lights are encouraged and security lights that do not create a nuisance for other homeowners are permitted.

Garage Doors: Garage doors should be opened only long enough to permit car access to garage or while someone is working outdoors.







Each February a look back at the year that was, is a necessary part of the planning for the year upcoming. Especially for a 50year neighborhood that is still a shining jewel in the crown of the City of Fort Wayne. As any neighborhood ages, there is a gradual shift from gaining amenities and services toward maintaining those same things. That is a natural shift and one that requires a vision toward the future and a focus on setting aside for the eventuality of replacing some of those things and revamping others.

2024 saw the dawning of many changes with one of the biggest being that we have a new Executive Director to work with us toward our goals of maintaining a very large and attractive neighborhood. The members, led by our Board of Directors, continue to desire fun activities, updated amenities, attractive grounds and a lot of "bang for the buck" so to speak.

Everyday focuses, such as Fun Days, Holiday events, clubhouse rentals and activities, like golf and tennis have been added to this year as members have come to us with ideas and requests. Our members wanted to learn new ways to beautify properties, so events like horticulture workshops have been added. They wanted to dance, so Ballroom dancing classes, taught by our talented member, professional dancer and business owner, Karen Jacobs, were added. Old favorites, like the Business Fair and a revamped version of the annual adult party poolside were brought back,

However, often approaching the difficult things led us into new directions and approaches to problem solving along the way. Our members, and even a couple of non-members, like Sean Gibson, the Arlington Park Swim Team Coach, have brought their own areas of expertise and knowledge to help out when needed this past year and continue to do so this year.

So, the State of the Association continues to be sound. The staff, including seasonal employees, are working hard for the members here. The Board of Directors never fail to amaze me as volunteers are willing to come forward to volunteer their time and expertise; meeting as a board and sub committees to bring the best to their neighborhood, setting aside personal desires in favor of the members as a whole, agreeing and disagreeing so that our members have the best place in Fort Wayne to



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
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
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
