Notice of Golf Cart Rules on Public Roadways

As summer approaches, we would just like to send a friendly reminder regarding the use of golf carts on public (city) roadways.

Below you will see the Indiana code regarding such. We understand that this can be frustrating, but also understand that there is nothing legally that we can do to change the code as an HOA.

Please note, that up to this point, security has not been ticketing residents, but rather, has had conversations with a few to reiterate the code. However, as it continues to be an issue, they will have no other option but to ticket.

Indiana Code (IC) 9-21-8-57 prohibits operating golf carts or off-road vehicles on highways,



except under specific conditions, namely, and ordinance adopted under IC 9-21-1-3(a)(14) and IC 14-1-1-20. The City of Fort Wayne does not permit golf carts to be used on public roadways. For this IC Code, highway and roadway are the same.

Mission of the Pool Advisory Committee

I. It is incumbent upon the members of the Pool Advisory Committee to do the following:

- Review and make recommendations to the Arlington Board of Directors concerning, but not limited to, policies, procedures, and rules involving the operation and utilization of the swimming pool facilities, as well as the construction, renovation, and/or any major capital.
- Review and make recommendations to the Arlington Board of Directors concerning, but not limited to, the budget for the pool facilities, including all expenditures and income, as well as the hiring of all pool personnel.

II. The membership of the Pool Advisory Committee shall consist of eight (8) Association members, and shall be originally appointed by the Arlington Board of Directors. Members will serve two year terms, and will be eligible for reappointment. Terms will exist on a calendar year basis.

The members of the Pool Advisory Committee will elect a chairperson, who will serve one year and will be eligible for reappointment.

Any vacancies on the Pool Advisory Committee will be filled by a simple majority vote of the Committee members, with a quorum of five members required.

* A mandatory restbreak is enforced 15 minutes on the hour.

ALL RESIDENTS AND THEIR GUESTS ARE WELCOME

The Arlington Park Pool Rules apply to all individuals (residents and/or guests) without regard to age, gender, race, disability and/or national origin, pursuant to all Federal, State and Local status, laws and ordinances.

POOL SAFETY COMES FIRST!

1. Members must have ID tags to be admitted to the pool area. All guests MUST be accompanied by an Arlington Park Member. Guest Fees: \$5 per adult and \$3.00 per child per day. Ask about our 3 and 7

day passes. The association is not responsible for lost or stolen items.

2. Individuals under the age of 12 or unable to be responsible for themselves must be accompanied by a responsible person 12 or over to gain entrance to the inside pool area. Non-adult members over the age of 12 and under the age of 21, may bring up to 3 guests in a visit.

3. Swimmers must pass a proficiency test (*See: Red Band Rule* section of document) in order to swim in any area of the lap/sports pool and/or deep end of the multi depth pool. **NON SWIMMERS ARE NOT ALLOWED IN THE LAP/SPORTS POOL AND/OR DEEP END OF THE MULTI-DEPTH POOL.** In addition, individuals wishing to use the 3 meter diving board also must meet the height requirement of 4 ft. or taller. Swim test may be administered to any member or guest at the discretion of the Lifeguards to ensure safe swimming for our members and guests.

4. **THE WADING POOL IS FOR NON-SWIMMING INDIVIDUALS ONLY.** Safe conduct and maximum occupancy is strictly enforced. Lifeguards are not provided in the wading pool; parents, guardians or a responsible individual must stay with non-swimming individuals in this pool to ensure safety.

5. U.S. Coast Guard approved personal flotation devices are permitted in the two shallow areas of the multi depth pool and the wading pool.

6. A rest break will be observed each hour for patrons under 18 other than individuals participating in a scheduled class or activity.

7. Diving is permitted in designated areas ONLY.

8. Lap lanes are reserved for proficient lap swimmers.

9. Eating and drinking in designated areas ONLY. No alcoholic beverages or glass permitted during regular pool hours. **NO COOLER PERMITTED.**

10. Pushing, running on the pool deck, profanity, vulgar remarks or misconduct shall not be permitted. Lifeguards have full authority to enforce rules.

11. Appropriate swim attire required. No street clothing or cutoffs. Dressing or undressing is restricted to the bathroom areas.

12. Incontinent individuals must wear approved swim diapers or plastic swim pants with tightly fitting elastic at the waist and leg openings. The Center for Disease Control (CDC) recommends diapers be checked and changed at least every 60 minutes and we request our members and guests adhere to this recommendation. There shall be no pool side changing of diapers, however, individuals may use the restroom areas. Proper, sanitary disposal of swim diapers is required.

13. NO PETS PERMITTED!

RULES AND REGULATIONS DIVING BOARD RULES

A swim proficiency test is required for all children under the age of 9 using the diving boards. (see Red Band Rule)

Children under the age of 9 must pass the Red

Band proficiency test and be at least 4 ft. tall to use the 1 meter or the 3 meter diving board – **FOR THE SAFETY OF OUR MEMBERS AND GUESTS THERE ARE NO EXCEPTION TO THIS RULE!**

Patrons must wait at the bottom of the ladder for their turn, taking care not to interfere with the divers.

Only one diver at a time is permitted on the board.

The diving board is the only entrance to the diving area in the pool.

Recreational divers must jump or dive using only one bounce. No running off the end of the board, handstands, sitting or back dives are permitted.

Only jumping and diving straight off the end of the board is permitted.

All divers must carefully observe the diving well and wait until the previous diver has cleared the area before diving.

Immediately after diving, the diver must surface and swim clear of the diving area.

All diving board equipment may be adjusted by Aquatic personnel ONLY.

Any activities deemed unsafe by the Aquatics personnel are not permitted.

Only one diving board may be in operation at any time in one pool facility.

Rules

1. **NO REFUNDS.**

2. Fees must be paid when swimmer is signed up.

3. Classes Limits to 6 swimmers unless otherwise stated.

4. Tiny Tots must wear a swim diaper.

5. A Release Form must be completed.

Class Dates:

*Make checks payable to Arlington Park Association, Inc.

Beginner I: 3 years and older. Continues to socialize water/pool area. Teaches good water safety. No skills necessary. Individual attention. 4 to 6 students in each class.

Beginner II: 4 years and older. Will put face in water. Can float and swim some strokes. Will jump off diving board. Individual attention with instructor. 4 to 6 students in each class.

Guest Policy

* Any member under the age of 21 may bring up to (3) guests per visit.

* Members 21 and older may bring up to 10 guests.

* Members bringing guests under the age of 21 must have (1) adult per (5) guests.

* In any one visit no more than 20 guests per household.

* For pool privileges Arlington defines an adult as a member of the community 21 years of age or older.

Guest Fees

* Guest adult for 1 day is \$5 per adult guest per day.

* Guest child for 1 day is \$3.00 per child guest per day (17 and under).

* Family weekend rate of \$15.00 per family for 3 consecutive days.

* Family weekly rate of \$30 maximum per family per week.

Babysitting Pass: \$30 per month per child (11 a.m.-5 p.m., M-F)

Pool Passes may be purchased at clubhouse office M-F from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. or from the lifeguards at the guard desk during pool hours.

Fun Days Celebration June 28th. No guest fees that day.

July 4th, Bring a Friend Day. No guest fees all day.

You must be a member to purchase a guest pass.

All guests must be accompanied by a member.

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Prepare for a Safe Fourth of July

Fort Wayne Fire Department joins with Fort Wayne Police Department and Three Rivers Ambulance Authority to encourage everyone to enjoy fireworks in the safest possible way. "We recommend for everyone's safety that they go to fireworks presented by trained professionals," said District Chief Jim Murua, Fort Wayne Fire Department Fire Marshal. "If they are going to purchase fireworks for private use, we encourage them to use fireworks responsibly and take safety precautions." Anyone with a fireworks-related complaint is to call the Fort Wayne Police Department at 427-1222.

The Fort Wayne City Ordinance governing the use of fireworks in Fort Wayne which is similar to Indiana's State Fireworks Law which does allow adults age 18 and older to purchase fireworks for use in Fort

Wayne on the user's property, the property of someone who has consented to the use of fireworks, or at a special discharge location designated by the State Fire Marshal. In the City of Fort Wayne, the fireworks may be used only between 5 p.m. and two hours after dusk (approximately 11 p.m.) from June 29-July 3 and July 5-9. On the day before Memorial Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, the day before Labor Day and Labor Day, the hours are extended from 10 a.m. to midnight. For New Year's Eve, the hours are 10 a.m. Dec. 31 until 1 a.m., Jan. 1.

"According to a report from the Indiana State Department of Health, in 2007 48% of all fireworks-related injuries in Indiana involved children and adolescents. They represent a quarter of Indiana's population so this is a concern. Of these injuries, 69% of cases reported burn in-

juries with burns to the hands being the most common type of burn injury," said Murua. He explained that of all the injuries in 2007, one in five of those injuries involved the eyes with 92% of those injuries due to not using any eye protection. He noted the report also said that fireworks use on private property accounted for 83 % of the reported injuries. "Fireworks injuries are often severe," he added.

Safety is always the key to any activity and this includes fireworks. For your safety, as well as that of your loved ones, neighbors and the community, the Fort Wayne Fire Department suggests you enjoy your fireworks at a professional event. 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FORT WAYNE OPEN BURNING CODE INFORMATION

§ 94.70 OPEN BURNING.

(A) This section shall further define Article 11 Chapter 1102 of the Fire Prevention Code as published by the Indiana Fire Prevention and Building Safety Commission.
BARBECUE PIT OR GRILL. A stationary or portable device, with either electric, gas or charcoal fuel, used for the preparation of food.
HAZARDOUS CONDITION. A situation where the Fire Department Officer in charge determines that the fire may be capable of spreading or damaging other property or that the smoke emissions may be offensive to occupants of surrounding property.
OPEN BURNING OR OPEN FIRE. Any burning of combustible materials out of doors. Excluded is burning in a barbecue pit or grill where the base fuel for heat is charcoal products.
RECREATIONAL OR CAMP FIRE. The burning of wood products other than refuse where the fuel being burned is not contained in an incinerator, outdoor fireplace, barbecue grill or barbecue pit. A **RECREATIONAL OR CAMP FIRE** shall have a total fuel area no greater than 36 inches in diameter and a fuel load not to exceed two feet in

height.

REFUSE. Garbage, rubbish, paper, leaves, grass, trade waste, trash, plastic or other waste products.

SMOKE NUISANCE. Smoke emissions may be deemed a nuisance when a complaint is received that the smoke emissions are offensive to the complaining party.

WOOD PRODUCTS. Untreated and unpainted lumber or natural wood other than leaves and vines. (Ord. G-28-99, passed 12-28-99)

§ 94.71 BURNING PROHIBITED.

(A) No person or business shall kindle or maintain any open burning consisting of a trash fire, leaf fire, bonfire, refuse fire, or other open burning.

(1) Exemptions. The following types of fire may be allowed:

(a) Bonfires celebrating school pep rallies.

(b) Recreational camp fires for scouting or family cookout activities.

(2) All exemptions shall be subject to the following:

(a) A garden hose connected to a water supply, buckets, shovel, fire extinguisher or other approved fire-extinguishing equipment shall be readily available at the burn site.

(b) A Burn Permit shall be obtained from the Fire Department at least 24 hours in advance of the permitted open burning. The burn permit signed by the Fire Chief or his designee shall be on site at the time of the permitted fire. Notwithstanding the foregoing, persons planning on or desiring to undertake recreational campfires for scouting or family cookout activities as set forth in § 94.71(A)(1)(b) above shall not be required to obtain a burn permit for such activities.

(c) Only wood products shall be burned - no leaves, paper or trash.

(d) A fire shall be attended by a responsible party as listed on the burn permit at all times until completely extinguished.

(e) If open burning creates a smoke nuisance, or a hazardous condition exists, the open burning shall be immediately extinguished.

(f) A fire shall be located at least 25 feet away from any structure, fence or right of way.

(B) Any person who recklessly, knowingly or intentionally kindles, or maintains any open burning consisting of a trash fire, leaf fire, bonfire, refuse fire, or other open burning that damages property of another person or spreads to property of another person may be liable

for criminal mischief.

(C) Burning other than mentioned in this article may be permitted provided a variance pursuant to 326 IAC 4-1-1 has been approved and received from the Indiana Department of Environmental Management. Burning must meet the restrictions of the variance. The variance must be registered with the Fire Department and on the burn site for verification.

(D) Penalties for violations of this chapter do not preclude the Department of Environmental Management from seeking legal action for violations of 326 IAC 4-1.

(E) Liability for fire. Any person

who allows the accumulation or existence of combustible material which constitutes or contributes to a fire may not refute liability for violation of this chapter on the basis that said fire was set by vandals, accidental or an act of God. (Ord. G-28-99, passed 12-28-99)

§ 94.72 ENFORCEMENT OF PROVISIONS.

The Fire Department, Police Department and the Department of Neighborhood Code Enforcement shall be charged with the duty of enforcing the terms of § 94.71.

Pool Storm Procedures

1. In the event that a storm arises in the immediate area, lifeguards are urged to keep a constant watch for signs of tornadoes hail or lightning and will close the pool for 30 minutes at a time as needed.
2. Should an electrical storm threaten, the pool will be immediately cleared and an announcement will be made of the closing.
3. If an electrical or hail storm causes the pool to be emptied, residents are not forced to leave the pool area, just to get out of the water until it is safe to return.

Pool Tornado Procedure

1. During a tornado watch the weather will be monitored for safety and may close as needed.
2. During a tornado warning the pool will be cleared and residents are encouraged to go home.

Fishing

Fishing is permitted in the lake areas of Brittany Village, Shenandoah Circle and Lake Crystal. Because we are privately owned a fishing license is not required.

The current harvesting rule is: No size limit on Bluegill, but Bass must be a minimum of 14 inches long to keep or they must be returned to the lake.

So just some quick reminders that relate to numerous calls and emails we have received here in the Clubhouse.

- Please ensure that you are utilizing the Doggie Pots we have throughout the Neighborhood on our Walking paths, as a common courtesy to all residents. Ensure that when you are disposing of the bags that they make it into the containers,

Fort Wayne's Tall Grass/Weed Program Returns this summer



The City of Fort Wayne has begun enforcing its tall grass/weed program today.

The program allows residents to report grass and weeds over nine inches. This is enforced through the Neighborhood Code Compliance.

The public can report possible violations by calling 311 or 260-427-8311. Individuals reporting a violation must provide the property's street address.

"Tall grass on one property can negatively affect an entire neighborhood," said Chris Blauvelt, Neighborhood Code Compliance Director. "The City of Fort Wayne's Weed Program not only addresses tall grass, but also assists in the prevention of other nuisances such as noxious vegetation, rodent, insects, and illegal dumping."

If a property is in violation,

they will receive a citation with a notice ordering them to mow within five days. Inspectors take a date-stamped electronic photo and post a placard on the cited property and a notice is mailed to the owner of the property.

If the property is still not up to the ordinance, the Neighborhood Code will send a private contractor to mow the property and send an invoice to the property owner. The owner will then be charged for the mowing. If the invoice is not paid within 30 days, a lien will be placed on the property. The charge is based on lot sizes.

Neighborhood Code Compliance employs eight seasonal, part-time inspectors who respond to concerns from the public, but also act protectively to identify high grass and weeds, particularly along high-traffic corridors.
